



Mericloning was being experimented with in France and quality orchids would have been hard to find. In recent years, many genera within Laeliinae. Oncidiinae and Aeridinae have had name changes which affected many intergenerics.

75 years ago, the Townsville Orchid Society would have been a great source of fellowship for a lot of people before the age of television, mobile phones and social media, but now, societies have to compete against these forms of technology.

There were members of this society whose names were known throughout Australia but sadly many of those people are no longer here to celebrate.

## A vibrant history of the Townsville Orchid Society

As the world was recovering from World War II, a small group of citizens decided to put a bit of colour and community spirit into Townsville. These six kindred spirits were orchid enthusiasts and keen to connect with others who had the same interests.

From a simple advertisement in the Townsville Daily Bulletin in June 1947, 75 years ago, a seed was sown. From these humble beginnings the Townsville Orchid Society was formed and continues to flourish.

#### The Inaugural Meeting – 20th June 1947

At this inaugural meeting on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> June 1947, "The Townsville Orchid Society" (TOS) was formed. This meeting was opened by Mr P. K. Searle on behalf of the convenors, with twenty-one enthusiasts in attendance. A temporary committee was formed and a sub-committee which was given the task of drafting rules for the Society.

#### The first General Meeting of the Townsville Orchid Society – 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 1947

At the first general meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> July 1947 the important business of adopting rules and electing officials was carried out. The rules adopted followed closely to those of the Queensland Orchid Society with one particular difference. TOS opted to admit junior members at a reduced subscription of 5/- per annum. This was in the hope of encouraging the younger generation to pursue this interesting hobby.

#### **Townsville Orchid Society Inc. Emblem**



At the next general meeting, held on 25<sup>th</sup> July,1947, a spectacular local orchid *Phalaenopsis rosenstromii*, commonly known as the Mt. Spec orchid, was chosen as the emblem of the Society and remains our emblem to this day. A badge bearing the image of this orchid can be found as our logo which is used in all our correspondence, advertising, prize certificates and signage. (Note: This orchid is now classified as *Phalaenopsis amabilis* subsp. *rosenstromii*).

#### PUBLIC EXHIBITIONS THROUGHOUT THE YEARS

#### 1948 – First Exhibition

It wasn't long before the Townsville Orchid Society had their first public exhibition. An invitation to Townsville citizens resulted in a capacity audience on Friday 24 September 1948, at 8pm.

ORCHIDS ORCHIDS TOWNSVILLE ORCHID SOCIETY presents Colour Transpatencies of Orchids with Display of Orchids and Pot Flants A W U HALL. FRIDAY, 24th Sept 8 pm Admission 11d

The show was opened by the patron Dr. J. Breinl. It took the form of a lantern lecture and an exhibition of locally grown orchids. The slides of the exotic, colourful orchids and commentary were provided by Mr W. Kirkwood of Cairns.

The exhibition of local orchids was described

by the Townsville Daily Bulletin as 'remarkable', of a surprisingly high quality, being the subject of much admiration. A thoughtful gesture on the part of the Society was to present all cut orchids to the Red Cross for its Chelsea flower show in Brisbane.

It was decided to make the Spring Show an annual event and it is now believed to be the oldest regular spring show in Australia.

#### 1949 – Floral Grandeur 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> September 1949



About 300 plants, all locally grown, were exhibited. They comprised about 13 species of North Queensland orchids, and 36 exotic varieties.

The Show was non-competitive and proceeded over 2 days, finishing at noon on Saturday.

### AN OUTSTANDING ORCHID



Townsville residents have recently had opportunities of appreciating the unexcelled beauty and fragrance of orchids, mass displayed by dozens of varieties by the Townsville Orchid Society. For individual brilliance, however, it is doubtful whether any of those blooms could compare with a magnificent specimen being displayed publicly for the first time by Mr. Stan Short, one of Townsville's foremost orchid lovers. When this picture was

taken the orchid was studded with seven exquisite blooms. These blooms, about six inches in diameter, consist of petals delicately shaded in light and dark pink, merging into vivid mauve lips of velvety appearance. Botanically, this wonderful manifestation of nature is known as Laelia Cattleya Excellency. '(Walters Studio, photo.)

#### 1952 – 5th Annual Exhibition of the Townsville Orchid Show

Citizens came out in their finery to witness what was described as 'the finest display of orchid blooms ever seen in North Queensland. '

#### 1953 – Magnificent Blooms at Orchid Show

It was reported in the Townsville Daily Bulletin (Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> September 1953) that 'Thousands of multi-coloured and fragrant blooms converted the Y.M.C.A. hall into a veritable fairyland, representing a capital investment of somewhere in the vicinity of £2000 by Townsville orchid enthusiasts.'

#### 1954 - The Royal Visit

The Townsville Orchid Society was heavily involved in providing orchids during the Queen's visit in March 1954. Not only were they asked to provide orchid blooms for presentation to the Queen and decoration of the Royal dais at the Sports Grounds, but they also received a request from the local agents of the Shaw, Savill, Albion company to provide a sufficient quantity of orchid blooms for the purpose of decorating the cabins of the S.S. Gothic during the Queen's visit to Townsville.

With the resources of some 80 members at its disposal, and kindred societies of North Queensland on stand-by, the Society was confident they could fulfil all requests.

The bouquet was comprised of cattleyas, vandas and native North Queensland orchids.

The Royal dais at the Sports Reserve was decorated with pots of *Dendrobium phalaenopsis* (Cooktown orchid more correctly now called *Den. bigibbum*) and *Dendrobium* 

*superbiens*, two of our colourful North Queensland natives, making it an exceedingly spectacular display.

#### 1954 – 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Exhibition



Even after supplying a massive quantity of orchids for the Royal visit in March, the Townsville Orchid Society presented what was described by the Deputy Mayor and Society Patron, Alderman John Breinl, as 'the best that had ever been staged in Townsville by the Society.'


The number of blooms and the number of varieties represented were a record for any show staged by the society.

Blooms of almost every conceivable colour and from almost every country in the world were on display, including a collection of valuable hybrid orchids recently imported by the Society from France, Holland and England. The value of the whole exhibition was between £3080 to £4000.

#### September 1983 – 8<sup>th</sup> Australian Orchid Conference

The 8<sup>th</sup> Australian Orchid Conference, organised and hosted by the Townsville Orchid Society, represented a milestone for provincial Orchid Societies. In a break from tradition, this was the first time the Australian Orchid Council had chosen to award its triennial conference to be held outside a capital city. What a privilege and a great success.

#### 1998 - 6th Asia Pacific Orchid Council (APOC) Conference

Townsville was highlighted on the World Orchid stage when the Society organised and hosted the 6<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Orchid Council Conference in 1998. Locals and inter-state attendees were joined by orchid enthusiasts from many overseas countries at this spectacular event.

In order to commemorative this important event, a joint stamp issue between the Commonwealth of Australia and the Republic of Singapore featuring beautiful orchids namely *Phalaenopsis rosenstromii*, *Arundina graminifolia*, *Grammatophyllum speciousum* and *Dendrobium bigibbum* was issued.

#### **Townsville Orchid Spectacular 2017**

In June 2017 the Townsville Orchid Society, hosted the Tropical Queensland Orchid Conference and Show marketed as the Townsville Orchid Spectacular. It was held at the Townsville Stadium, located at the Murray Sports Complex. This coincided with the Townsville Orchid Society's 70<sup>th</sup> Birthday. It was an outstanding project with massive displays that connected vendors, clubs, hobbyists and the general public together through orchids.



#### 1965/66 - Formation of TQOC and the first regional conference

"As a direct result of the formation of the Queensland Affiliated Society Secretariat the TOS moved to form a Townsville Study Group" (AOR, June 1965). The Group was chaired by Mr. Ron Merritt, President of TOS. It held Australia's first regional Orchid Conference in Townsville. Support was so strong and interest so wide, that the advantage of even closer co-operation became apparent and societies from Rockhampton to Innisfail joined with the Townsville Society to establish the Tropical Queensland Orchid Council (TQOC). (AOR March1966). Mr. J. K. Tate of TOS was the first president. TOS has since organised numerous TQOC conferences, enabling orchid enthusiasts from far and wide to meet in Townsville.

#### The Townsville Orchid Society's Hall

#### 1985 – A Hall of Our Own

Until 1978, meetings and shows had been held in various locations throughout the city. The Souths Junior Rugby League Hall in Pioneer Park, Thuringowa (now the Riverway precinct) became a regular meeting place for the TOS, and in 1985, when it was put up for sale, TOS made an offer that was accepted. It was due to the financial success of the 1983 AOC conference, and financial support from members, that allowed this to occur. So, on 26 April 1985, TOS held its first meeting in their own hall, renamed 'The Townsville Orchid Society Hall' and making history as the first orchid society in Australia to own its own premises.

#### 2005 - Opening of the new Townsville Orchid Society Hall

By August 2004, our Hall was destined to be demolished to make way for the Thuringowa Riverway project. A temporary meeting place was found whilst negotiations took place with the Thuringowa City Council with respect to compensation, allocation of land and the construction of a new building. With assistance through various Government and Community grants and a small loan, guaranteed by supportive members, a new hall was commissioned.

Almost 12 months later, on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July, the Hall was officially opened. Our inaugural Patron, Dr Breinl was invited to open the new hall.

Along with Dr Breinl, Peter Lindsay, Member for Herbert, Craig Wallace, Member for Thuringowa, Les Tyrell, Thuringowa Mayor and Tony Mooney, Townsville Mayor were invited guests. Members of 52 years Tom and Lesley Verran attended the opening of the new hall. Mrs Verran and her husband joined the Society before they were married and their fascination with orchids continued throughout their married life. Ted Boon, a member since 1995 was also in attendance.

#### 2022 – 75<sup>th</sup> Birthday Celebrations

To celebrate in style and to involve the local and wider community, a decision was made to move our 2022 Winter orchid show to a much larger venue. For this special occasion, it has been renamed the 75<sup>th</sup> Birthday Gala Show and Sales. The competition has been expanded to include members of other orchid clubs, who have been invited to enter their orchids into the judging.

There will be the usual tabletop displays of colourful orchids, all competing for minor prizes, and ultimately, the Grand Champion ribbon. Sponsorship has been gained for some of the Champion ribbons and the Grand Champion prize has been elevated to a massive \$500.



Local horticultural groups have been given the opportunity to display their plants, thus promoting their own organisations. A shopping paradise awaits with additional vendors coming from as far south as Bundaberg and north to Mt Molloy.

#### Phalaenopsis amabilis var papuana

The symbol of the Townsville Orchid Society is the Moth Orchid which occurs on Mr. Spec and the Seaview Range. This large-flowered white *Phalaenopsis* has had a variety of names since it was first discovered in Queensland by Count rosenstrom about the turn of the Century.

The first mention of *Phalaenopsis* in Australia appears to be the description of *P. rosenstromii* by F.M. Bailey in the Queensland Agricultural Journal for November, 1906. The only notes, other than the Latin description, given by Bailey are: "Hab: On trees, high from the ground, Daintree River, Gus. Rosenstrom".

The first writtenrecord of this species occuring at Mt. Spec appears to be by W.A. Nichols in the North Queensland Naturalist in 1936, although plants must have been known from there for sometime previously. A. Glindeman, a well-known orchid collector of the period, sent plants from Mt. Spec to Nicholls in 1935. Nicholls (1936) suggested that the Queensland plants were the same as *P. amabilis* a wide-spread South East Asian species. In 1945 he published a more detailed argument proving this to be the case, but in 1949 he reinstated the name "rosenstromii" as a variety of *P. amabilis*. This was where the matter stood until 1969 when H.R. Sweet showed that the Australian plants were identical to the previously-named New Guinea variety, *P. amabilis* var. papuana. To date the known Queensland distribution is: Mt. Spec, Seaview Range, Mossman River, Daintree River, McIlwraith Range, Iron Range. It has been heavilycollected and is now rare in the southern part of the range, but remains in fair numbers, although never really plentiful, on Cape York Peninsula. It is a species of rainforests, usually below 500 m altitude, usually in gorges and often growing near watercourses low down on trees or on protected rock faces. In nature the leaves often bear the scars of insect attack. The flowering period is in Summer.

Bailey named his original species after the Collector Count Rosenstrom. A few common names have been applied this species, but few have really gained much currency. e.g. Moth Orchid, Mt. Spec Orchid, White Moth and Goat-eared Orchid (in reference to the large drooping petals.)

*Phalaenopsis amabilis* var. *papuana* is a good subject for cultivation, particularly in North Queensland where it can be grown on a tree in the garden or on a slab or pot. A well grown specimen has a long branched inflorescence with large white flowers, the equal of any naturally - occuring species of the genus and one of the finest of the orchids.





The Ted Boon Trophy is conferred annually for the plant with the highest Judges' points awarded at a monthly TOS meeting.

Ted Boon joined TOS on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1956 as a mere youngster. Upon receiving his application for membership, the committee changed the constitution to include junior members. Ted served times as Secretary from 1967 to 1980 and President from mid2015 to 2017. He was



heavily involved with judging. Ted was awarded TOS Life

Membership in 2004.





## Tropical Queensland Orchid Council (TQOC) First Award

The TQOC awarded its very first orchid in 1967. This was a Certificate of Cultural Merit awarded to *Trichocentrum lanceanum CCM/TQOC* [Onc. lanceanum CCM/TQOC] owned by Ted Boon.

#### T.Q.O.C. makes first Award G. K. RIDGE

In December, 1967, the Tropical Queensland Orchid Council judging panel made its first award — to Mr. E. A. (Ted) Boon for his Oncidium lanceanum.

The plant which gained a Certificate of Cultural Merit was growing in an 8" concrete pot and bore 22 flower spikes, 3 of them budded only. There was a total of 154 open flowers and 16 buds.

The flowers were of good form and colour the lip being particularly bright and the flowers were normal size despite the quantity borne.

For the past several years the plant has steadily increased in size and flowered for the first time in Townsville in 1966, producing 6 spikes. It had previously been grown on the Atherton Tabelands.

With so much growth and no flowers, Ted's father, Eric (in his absence) tried shifting it and it has been alternatively under 64% Sarlon and under a tree getting stronger early morning and late afternoon sun. It produced the flowers whilst growing in the area of stronger light and was left there after the 1966 flowering to produce this magnificent flowering in 1967.

The potting medium is tree fern and oak bark and it is fed with liquid manure and Aquasol.

Ted, although he started growing orchids in the north (Atherton and Townsville), just recently returned to Townsville from Toowoomba where he was a member of the local society. He is now Hon. Secretary of the Townsville Orchid Society of which he has been a member for 13 years.
