List for Field Day 21 June to be circulated at May meeting.

Charles Lee, aided by a slide programme, spoke well on choice of tags, how they should be written and what items to be used to write on them etc. Thanks very much Charles – information much appreciated by those present.

E Boon asked what happened to Show rule banning the sale of garden plants by members as he saw several on the sales tables at Autumn Show. No one present remembered such a rule and not contained in present list of rules.

Thanks to E Boon who gave a commentary on the tabled plants, following the tea break.

**Registrar's Choice: Hybrids:** Phal. Mount Lip - gaining 80 Points – owned by F&D Marnock. **Species:** V. *lamellata* – gaining 79 Points – owned by A Steel. Congratulations to the growers – well grown.

<u>General Business:</u> Following a request by J Nicholson that purchase of a card reader be considered, E Boon Moved a Motion "that Society purchase a card reader for the Society." Seconded T Keith. Carried.

R Rasmussen requested that the Management Committee consider wireless internet for use by the Society – to be considered at Management level.

Lucky door and Raffles: were drawn – congratulations to all. Meeting Closed: 9.51pm.

#### Condensed Minutes of Management Committee meeting 1.05.09

N Grant Moved a Motion "I move that a new clause be inserted in the Orchid Show Rules, Bylaw 12 "Sales of Plants at Shows, as follows:

(k) All persons with purchased plants shall be discouraged from leaving the Hall by way of the Show Section. No person may take a purchased plant from the Hall by way of the Show Section, unless escorted by a Society member.

And that current subsections (k) and (l) be renamed subsections (l) and (m)." Seconded C Lee. Carried.

J Nicholson Moved Motion "that a pre-nominated amount of money be agreed to for a float for every show at the management committee meeting, and that nobody use their own money and no money belonging to the T.O.S. Inc. be carried in a person's pocket." Seconded J White. Carried.

Resolved that members park in other car park near basketball courts, or out back if fine, at shows, to leave parking in front of hall free for public attending show. Extra boxes of plants be placed under sales tables, not stacked in front. Members should not have plants from other members on sales tables.

T Keith referred to E Boon's remarks (at general meeting) re bush plants being sold at show - resolved rule not known but no problem.

R Daveson spoke re pieces of paper in price tags. Resolved to have a supply of tags in office for members to replace any tags missing from pots, which will be placed under table until member available to replace tag.

Final decisions made re sausage sizzle 17 May.

On Tuesday May25, 1909 "The New York Times" printed this story on their front page. While New Yorkers were engrossed in this fascinating news story, another important event was being played out elsewhere.

On this day, Aileen Partlett was making her grand entrance into a world so different from what we live in today. It was not long later (25<sup>th</sup> July 1909) that "the pioneer aeronaut Louis Bleriot made history by becoming the first pilot to cross the English Channel in a rickety monoplane. The 37-minute flight won a £1,000 prize offered by Lord Northcliffe, the owner of the London Daily Mail, to the first man to cross the Channel in powered flight." Just think how far you could travel today in a "powered" aeroplane.

In case you gentle readers have not cottoned on yet, Aileen will be celebrating her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday on Monday, 25<sup>th</sup> May.

### MOTOR ABLAZE IN BROADWAY.

Mr. and Mrs. Hanan Have a Narrow Escape from the Tonneau.

Broadway, crowded at the theatre hour last night, saw a motor car suddenly burst into flames and a man and a woman escape from it just in time.

The car belonged to J. H. Hanan, the shoe manufacturer, who, with his wife, was in it. The accident occurred at Broadway and Forty-first Street. The traffic officer at the corner had halted Mr. Hanan's chauffeur, J. W. Matteson. The chauffeur stopped so suddenly that the car immediately behind him, which was running at good speed, jammed into Mr. Hanan's car before it could stop, making a large hole in the gasoline tank.

Matteson knew by the shock that something was broken, but he had no idea that his car was on fire until he started to go ahead, when the flames leaped up the sides of the automobile.

Mrs. Hanan screamed, and both she and Mr. Hanan tried in vain to open the door. The chauffeur jumped from the box and swung the door open, and the two escaped, while the flames leaped around them.

A throng of several hundred quickly gathered, and Mr. Hanan pushed his way with difficulty through it, holding Mrs. Hanan in his arms, for she had very nearly fainted. They made their way down the street to the Metropolitan Opera House, where they were going to the Lambs Club Gambol. Mr. and Mrs. Hanan live at the Belmont, and they returned there later in the evening.

In the meantime some one had turned in a fire alarm, and soon the whistles of the engines coming in all directions brought still more of a crowd. Broadway soon became blocked. The Fire Department soon extinguished the blaze, and the car was taken back to the garage at 42 East Forty-first Street.

"The car which ran into us," said Matteson, the chauffeur, "was numbered 31,313. It must have been going rather rapidly to have destroyed the tank so completely."

Mr. Hanan's car cost, when new, \$6.500. The body was almost completely destroyed.


