Midnight Street Mystery

Well, Miss Marple's investigation has solved the mystery. Just a reminder to readers as to the origins of this mystery. The *Lc.* Midnight Street plants that were being sold at our Winter show sparked a bit of discussion because the Wildcatt database showed it as *Sc.* Midnight Street = *S. crispata* x *C.* Highburiensis, whereas AQPlus 3.5 showed *Lc.* Midnight Street = *L. flava* x *C.* Highburiensis, and the Royal Botanical Gardens Kew website lists it as *Lc.* Midnight Street = *C. crispata* x *C.* Highburiensis.

Miss Marple was very quick to point out that *Sophronitis crispata* and *Laelia flava* are heterotypic synonyms, thus solving the parents' naming confusion.

She was just as quick to point out that the reorganising of *Sophronitis*, *Laelia*, *Cattleya* etc. that is going on at the moment is an ongoing conglomeration of confusion best left to another chapter.

Thanks to the many readers, well 3 anyway, who offered their solutions. It is also noted that its other parent is *C.* Highburiensis = *C. loddigesii* x *C. mossiae* (*Cattleya harrisoniana* is a synonym for *Cattleya loddigesii* var. *harrisoniae*) not to be confused with *Sc.* (or is that now *Lc.* or now even *C.*) Highburiensis = *C. lawrenceana* x *C. cinnabarina*.

This group really excelled themselves at this meeting with a wonderful array of flowering orchids and it was very rewarding to see so many members bring along their plants for the Popular Vote Section. In the open section Noel Grant was 1st, Ray & Barbara Robinson 2nd and Neita Coulson 3rd. The Novice winners were 1st Mavis Papalexion, 2nd Michael & Lyn Gudge with Doris Blakeney, Don & Thelma McDonald, Caroline Swart and Francis Maltby all tied for 3rd placing.



Our guest speaker was Jeff Knowles who showed all the members his method of how he deflasks his *Phalaenopsis* seedlings simply by adding a small quantity of water to the flask and then with a gentle shaking of the bottle to loosen the agar substance. He then removes the plants from the bottle with a small wire hook into a bowl of water to remove any other remaining agar from their roots. Alison then showed how to plant the seedlings in which Alison calls a donut pot with Sphagnum Moss as the potting media with a covering of a mixture of small rock, bark and charcoal on the top. Spray the plants with a misting of Envy and they are now ready for the shade house area to grow on. We wish to thank Jeff & Alison for sharing with us your time, knowledge and advice on this subject.

SHOW RULES - (AS UPDATED MARCH 2008)

By-Law 11. SHOWS

- a) The Society shall conduct seasonal shows as determined from time to time by the Management Committee. The Shows shall be managed by a Show Marshall, who shall be the Vice President/Committee Chairman, or a member appointed by the show committee, and confirmed by the Management Committee.
- b) Rules governing Shows and Show Schedule shall be published in the Society Calendar Booklet completed at the beginning of each year.
- c) Entries of orchids in the shows are free and open to all financial members of the Society.
- d) The Show Marshall, along with the Registrar and volunteer helpers will prepare the show area prior to the receiving and benching of entries.
- e) Entries shall be benched and available for judging by 7pm the Thursday evening of the show weekend.
- f) Judging of plants will be by A.O.C. accredited judges, and judged as per the A.O.C. Guidelines for Judges, where they do not conflict with Townsville Orchid Society Inc. procedures. Judging of displays will be at the discretion of the show committee. **The decision of the Judges will be FINAL.**
- g) Although it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to enter the plant in the correct class, and place it in position on the show bench, the Show Marshall and Registrar (in consultation) have the right to determine the class in which any plant may be exhibited, to reject, remove or re-arrange any entry. The Show Marshall and Registrar (in consultation) shall combine where less than 3 plants are entered in any one class.
- h) All plants entered shall be the property of the exhibitor. The plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for the preceding 6 (six) months.
- i) Individual plants may be entered in only one class, and must be in show condition. The Show Marshall & Registrar, in consultation, have the right to refuse the exhibition of any plant which in their opinion, appears aged, diseased or infested. The Show Marshall shall have the right to remove any plant with spent flowers deemed to distract from the exhibit.
- j) Staking and tying to support the inflorescences will be permitted as A.O.C. Rules. Parafilm or florist tape is not allowed as ties.
- k) All classes will have a minimum of three (3) entries. Sizes of displays are at the discretion of the show sub-committee.
- l) The Grand Champion orchid of the show shall be selected from the winners of the Class Section Champions.
- m) The Reserve Champion orchid of the show shall be selected from the remaining winners of the class champions, plus the second placed orchid chosen from the Grand Champion's section.
- n) The Novice Champion and Reserve Champion – encouragement awards – The Show Marshall will identify Novice New Growers' plants by stickers. Judging Panel will then select Novice Champion and Novice Reserve Champion.
- o) Charges for admission to the shows shall be recommended by the show committee, and are to be ratified by the Management Committee.
- p) Members are asked to volunteer as show officials (door attendants, raffle ticket sellers, sales assistants, and security personnel etc.). Members exhibiting or assisting in any way, will be admitted free to the show area at all times.
- q) Show officials are to wear identification badges as supplied by the Society. Officials are required to assist with cashier, door, security and public relations, and to keep on the move as much as possible.
- r) No exhibition, exhibit or plant shall be removed from the hall until the termination of the show. Members of the general public are not permitted in the show section while the dismantling is taking place.
- s) Stealing of blooms or pollen may lead to initiation of legal action.
- t) Photography may be done at any time, but not at the inconvenience of judges or show patrons.
- u) The Society or its agents will accept no responsibility for theft, destruction of plants, loss, or damage of any kind occasioned to plants entered in shows.
- v) Entry in shows shall indicate acceptance by, and be conditional on, the exhibitor agreeing to be bound by these By-Laws.
- w) Pots must be clean and undamaged – damaged pots may be placed inside a clean pot. Unstable plants must be placed inside a larger pot and made stable. Presentation points will be deducted for failing to observe this rule.

By-Law 12. SALES OF PLANTS AT SHOWS

- a) Members are invited to sell surplus plants at all shows. Members entitled to participate in the sale of plants are:
 - (i) Show set up workers;
 - (ii) Exhibitors of a minimum of five (5) flowering plants who work on the roster.
- b) Allocation of selling space will be determined by the Show Chairman, from the space available and number of sellers positions will be decided by a ballot conducted by the Show Sub-Committee, subject to payment of a five dollar (\$5) booking fee, paid to the Treasurer no later than one (1) month before the show – This fee is refundable, provided the table is utilised. If the number of required areas exceed the space available, then individual sales areas will be reduced in size at the Show Marshall's discretion. A membership entitles the member to one sales area only.
- c) Plants must be established, clean and presentable, free of pests and diseases.
- d) The Show Chairman together with the Registrar or a Senior judge in his absence, has the right to reject sales plants from members' sales tables deemed unsuitable for sale.

- e) A space will be set aside in the sales area (if required) to accommodate plants for members who do not have sufficient saleable plants to warrant applications for sales spaces. A maximum of ten (10) plants per day per member will be eligible. To encourage Novice Growers who wish to sell, they are not required to meet the condition re exhibiting of a minimum of five (5) flowering plants in the Show, provided they work on the roster.
- f) Apart from the plant name label, a second label, showing the seller's initials or Member Number, with the price (which must be in multiples of 50 cents), is to be placed with each plant.
- g) Members rostered for duty in the Sales Section are required to wear identification badges supplied by the Society, and are to keep on the move, be prepared to answer questions, and at all times promote sales from **ALL** tables, and not from their own.
- h) The Society shall provide a Cashier's table in (or adjacent to) the Sales Section, and it will be the responsibility of members manning this table to collect all proceeds from sales, together with the second label {as above (g)}, and to monitor the public as they leave the area.
- i) The Society shall deduct a donation from the sale of plants, the percentage decided by the Management Committee, and the Treasurer will be responsible for collection of donation and payments to vendors.
- j) No unsold plants may be removed from the Sales Section prior to the termination of the show. **For safety reasons, NO MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC will be allowed in the hall while show is being dismantled. Plant Sales are to be conducted OUTSIDE the hall.**
- k) All persons with purchased plants shall be discouraged from leaving the Hall by way of the Show Section. No person may take a purchased plant from the Hall by way of the Show Section, unless escorted by a Society member.
- l) The Society or its agents will accept no responsibility for theft, destruction of plants, loss, or damage of any kind to plants submitted for sale.
- m) The submission of plants for sale will indicate acceptance by, and be conditional on the seller to be bound by these By-Laws.
