Unfortunately there was not enough to go around so Robert again offered to get another load the next day for any member who missed out. The speakers for the afternoon were Ray Robinson and Warren who spoke on *Dendrobium* Orchids and the differences between Hard Cane Dendrobiums, Soft Canes and the *Calastia* or four square type *Dendrobiums*. They also pointed out how they are best grown in cultivation, how the *Phalaenanthe* and the *bigibbum* orchid have a dormant period in their growth pattern, Intermedia and Spatulata type do not have a rest period and the Calastia type do not like to be divided, only like to be potted on as it seems to affect their flowering pattern. It is always rewarding to have members who are willing to share their view and ideas to help our members and visitors.

Unfortunately we have to say good-bye to Don and Thelma McDonald from our group as they are returning to Sydney to live closer to other members of their family, we have enjoyed their company and we would like to wish them all the best in the future.
