Considering that we in Townsville are now in the flowering cycle of *phalaenopsis*, how many of our conditions match those listed above? Today in my orchid house the humidity was only 40%, way short of the 70-80% they would maintain in orchid houses in Taiwan, with a temperature range of 24-10 °C. Yes I am fertilising with Peters Professional Blossom Booster (10:30:20 – available from the members' shop), pH of 6.2 and concentration of about 1.2 ms/cm. Light intensity - I am not sure about (Thought: TOS could purchase a few appropriate light meters for the library or technical officer.) Now – how can I control that humidity?

What are your conditions like? Plenty of food for thought here, don't you think?
