Catasetum Growing in North Queenland. By Delia Hobden

Catasetum, a tropical orchid genus found in the American tropic, would have to be one of the most fascinating orchids I have grown.

These orchids are deciduous for several months of the Year, mainly between May and September and during this time watering should be reduced to once a week. Once new growth appears in spring, it is time to start repotting and is best to do this before new roots appear so they are not damaged. Psuedobulbs can be divided and repotted as single mature bulbs, but if the bulbs are on the small size, it is best to leave several bulbs together. Squat pots are preferred and any rich medium media is good. I use Sunshine Orchid Nursery slipper mix and

prefer to repot every year, as in our hot climate the mixture turns sour.

After repotting it is now a vital time as plants require lots of water and fertilizer as you only have three to four months to mature the plants. As psuedobulbs mature, harden them by giving them slightly more Light. Flower spikes will start to appear and some plants will flower twice a year. It is now time to cut back on the water and fertilizer. As the leaves start to go yellow do not cut the leaves off as this is their natural food source. When the leaves fall off, be careful handling the plants as they have spikes on the tips of the bulbs which are their only protection in their natural habitat. Spider mites are a common pest of these orchids and spraying with recommended miticides is advised.

For those members that may require a system that is able to keep track of their orchids, the following information is directly from OrchidWiz. We have been using Encyclopedia 8.0 for the last two years, and it has proven to be an excellent program for the recording of all our orchids (not that we have many), for example; when adding photographs it is interesting to note the variations in color from year to year. This program also makes it easy to keep track of repotting, watering and fertilizer routines etc. (see following information from OrchidWiz).

Regards Fred and Donna Marnock OrchidWiz Express 2012 is an easy-to-use application that allows orchid growers to get cultivation and genealogy information for thousands of species and more than 145,000 hybrids. It is aimed at the beginner to intermediate hobby grower. Growers can keep track of their orchids by using the Orchid Journal, as well as print labels for their tags. This version of OrchidWiz comes with more than 4,000 photographs of the most common species and hybrids. Available at www.orchidwiz.com for only \$95.00.
