Show Report: Most Sales Table \$5's have not been refunded from Winter Show. List available – see Treasurer about receipt for roll-over to Spring Show. Show Duty Roster being circulated. F Marnock asked that members check all pots and plants for show to make sure all in good shape.

General Meeting:

C Lee announced that he would be presenting a Notice of Motion for consideration at the A.G.M. in October regarding position of Treasurer.
