Unfortunately I was away from the Novice meeting when our worthy Assistant Treasurer (and I thank him for standing in as Treasurer for the past year), spoke about the A.G.M. I don't support much of what he is reported to have said. Jean and I certainly would like a break, but are not going to let the Society down. As for candidates for Treasurer needing to be "qualified," that is just plain rubbish. Anyone who has managed a household's finances could do the job. It is big at show time – bus trips – field day, but that's why we usually have an Assistant Treasurer. Just think, over the past ten years Treasurers have been Wal, Jean, Warren, Rodney, Charles – if they can do it so can you. There are going to be other vacancies, so put your name forward PLEASE!!

On more mundane matters, air-conditioning is finally well advanced (no doubt working by the time you've read this) - the Council has indicated that the irrigation (irritation) will be in during this financial year - and by now the Field Day should be behind us, and indications are that it should be very successful with up to seventy names listed to attend.

Apart from the annual luncheon at the end of next month, we will be free of major activities for several months (April's Autumn Show). Show ribbons were ordered without a year mentioned for 2013, enabling anyone who does not want to keep their ribbon, returning it to be recycled in 2014. Several years ago it was decided to relax our rules about who can sell at shows, so that if one of our willing workers is unable to display five flowering orchids in the show, provided he/she works on the set-up etc., then he/she is entitled to a sales table. This relaxation has caused considerable dissention at recent shows, so from now on the display of five flowering orchids will be an essential requirement for a sales table.

As this will be my last "comments" for the 2013/14 year I wish to take the opportunity to congratulate and thank all members for a very successful year, particularly the Committee Members, and wish the Society well for the New Year.

Unfortunately our Guest Speaker Tony Grice was unavailable to attend this meeting for his views on the safe handling of Chemicals needed to control Pests & Diseases in our Orchid Houses, John Sibthorpe and Wal Carlill both offered to give us their ideas on this subject. John only joined our Society last year and it was quite interesting to hear how he had approached this subject knowing full well how dangerous it was when using chemicals in your orchid house. John commented on what he considered to be are the five most important items that we all should remember when spraying chemicals substances are our feet, hands, mouth, nose and eyes. Wal also spoke on this subject and a fertiliser programme that he uses to grow his orchid plants it was very rewarding to have John and Wal come forward and help out and it is great to have other people ideas on growing orchids. Thank you John and Wal for helping us on this occasion for a job you both done well..

For those of us who live in the tropic now is the time for dividing, repotting or mounting our orchids on slabs as most of the plants will be sending out new roots and pseudobulbs at this time of the year.

Don't forget about your Dendrobium and Phalaenopsis seedlings for our growing competition as we need to take measurements each month to see how well you are growing them. The Phalaenanthe seedling should have started to send out new growth so now is the time for more water and fertiliser to help it grow better. Singapore Orchid Show 2014. (16th to 24th August, 2014.) This Orchid Show is organised by the Orchid Society of South East Asia (OSSEA) and at such shows, they will normally have talks organised. OSSEA will also host an appreciation dinner for judges and supporters of the orchid show. They will have overseas judges and they have already put up Alison's name to the Judging subcommittee.

<u>Computerised Orchid Database</u>. Order is being finalised and the copies might not be here at the October meetings.

New Product (biological fungicide). Their basic mix consists of Essential Plus 1-0-1 (growth chemicals – jk), Companion Biological Microbial Inoculant (biological fungicide, Bacillus subtilis GB03 –jk), "TKO" Phosphite0-12.5-21.8 (P and K –jk), and Micrel Total (Trace elements –jk).

The data about the "Companion Biological Microbial Inoculant" caught my eye. "Companion® Biological Fungicide is a safe, 100 percent natural biological fungicide that both prevents and controls a broad spectrum of root and foliar diseases such as root rot, blight, wilt, bottom- and stem-rot, and bacterial leaf spot (Phytophthora, Pythium, Fusarium, Rhizoctonia, Sclerotinia and Xanthomonas campestris). The Bacillus subtilis GB03 isolate combats disease pathogens though multiple modes of action. It quickly colonizes a plant's root hairs (and leaf surface) and literally crowds out disease producing microbes in the soil. It produces antibiotics that disrupt the cell wall formation of pathogens, causing the pathogens to desiccate and die; and it creates a beneficial Induced Systemic Resistance (ISR) whereby plants' own natural immune system is stimulated to better resist diseases. Used alone, in combination with, or in rotation with chemical fungicides, Companion can serve a crucial role in a grower's disease resistance management program." It is compatible with most high quality fertilisers, micronutrients, organic materials, wetting agents, surfactants, fungicides, herbicides and insecticides." Most importantly it lists application rates and frequency for orchids. It can be applied as a dip (8mL/L), drench (1.2mL/L) or mist (0.13mL/L). The cost is about \$50.00/L.
