# In Noel's Bush House 18

Vanda garayi (Christenson) L.M. Gardiner (2012)

formerly: Ascocentrum garayi Christenson 1992

purchased as : Ascocentrum miniatum (Lindl.) Schltr. (1913)

now: Vanda miniata (Lindl.) L.M. Gardiner (2012)

I have recently re-named this universally admired small orchid as *Vanda garayi*. I purchased it in 2004 as *Ascocentrum miniatum* (now called *Vanda miniata*), but I have been reading recently that the majority of plants sold under that name may actually be *V. garayi*.

I found the differences are as follows: *V. garayi* has solid orange colour, very elliptical sepals and petals and has a straight lip, whereas *V. miniata* has clearer, more transparent orange flowers with more noticeable veining, the petals and sepals are narrower than those on *V. garayi*, and, most noticeably, the lip is recurved (it bends down and back towards the spur). I had a close look at my plant during the current flowering and saw flowers with a clear orange colour, no visible veining on the petals and sepals and sepals and a straight lip. Obviously, my plant is *V. garayi*.

It is found in Thailand, Cambodia and Vietnam, but like most orchids from this area it has been extensively collected from the wild and is threatened with extinction.

My plant is a strong grower, and this year I was delighted to see 19 flower spikes on it. Those who visited during the recent Townsville Orchid Society Field Day will remember the visual impact it made. A thought – I have another plant (currently labelled as V. miniata) – why did it have only two flower spikes?
