Business Arising From Correspondence: Looking into J Pankhurst's query; water pipe broken on side wall with spill of unknown quantity of water. Police informed - Insurance claim under way. W Nicholson would like to take Fenwick to Fair Trading – vote to do nothing. Discussion on congratulating letter to M Keith. G Kelly Moved Motion "to send letter of Congratulations to M Keith on receipt of Award from A.O.F." Seconded by W Sewell. Vote 5 to 4 to write letter. President & Secretary refused to write letter. 1 members had left meeting so there was not a quorum to make Motion legal.

<u>Registrar's Choice: Hybrids:</u> V. Pine Rivers 'Wasana' gained 81 Points for G & S Kelly. <u>Species:</u> *Aerides godefroyana* gained 82 Points for W&J Nicholson. Congratulations to owners.

Financial Report: Brief statement given by W Nicholson as Treasurer away ill. Complaint by C Bersinski and W Nicholson explained we only have 11 out of 17 members willing to work on committee. To discuss matter later.

Bark: have orders for 28 bags so will be ordering a pallet (40 bags) soon. Please get orders in soon. Quincan comes in several sizes – see R Rasmussen. Had enquiry about how effective mycorrhizal fungicide is.

<u>W Sewell:</u> voiced several complaints – Luncheon taken out of his hands - Chef On Call v Golden Roast; field day – words said at celebration taken as sarcasm – more details re new members in bulletin required – membership list not up to date – list of new members not available. Answered by W Nicholson – membership list will be finalised in February as receipt books have been lost for some periods.

<u>Calendar:</u> no calendar will be published this coming year – information re dates will be issued.

<u>Tabled Plants:</u> C Truscott (Dens.) and P Lucke (Catts.) gave talks on plants with E Boon speaking on remainder.

<u>Meeting Closed:</u> 9.15pm. High Tea served and <u>Lucky Door</u> <u>and Raffles</u>: drawn – congratulations to all winners.

President's Comment:

Our January meeting will be the first under the new arrangements. So I will write another item explaining all. Unfortunately, last meeting, 28 November 2014, was a claytons meeting (the meeting you have when you're not having a meeting) as, although we started with a quorum (23) one left almost as soon as we started and another a few minutes later – hence the minutes published are not valid. I should have halted proceedings but was distracted while dodging the barbs being delivered by a couple of disgruntled members.

Apart from the above I'm having trouble sorting out, in my mind, as to what happened at the General Meeting or was it Committee Meeting?

In the last Bulletin (November) I mentioned that the Management Committee had approved sales for future General Meetings, provided that only flowering orchids were offered for sale. You probably won't believe this but we have been told that the term "flowering orchids" is confusing. Well! all of the Committee present at last meeting, could not believe this as they considered that "flowering orchids meant orchid plants which are currently in flower."

So no plants can be offered if they aren't orchid plants, and no orchid plants can be sold if they don't bear flowers at the time. Is that clear? – only flowering orchids may be sold – simple?

The idea of accustoming members to show foliage plants at shows prior to our T.Q.O.C. Inc. (70th Birthday) Conference was not favoured, but any members wishing to show foliage plants at interim T.Q.O.C. Inc. Conferences are encouraged to do so as in the past and in accordance with the show rules. For some time I have been concerned about the fact we conduct three shows over about six months and have none right through summer. It occurred to me that I, and a number of other members, have quite a few plants (orchids) in flower during December, with no sales opportunity available, and many people wanting flowering orchids for Christmas presents.

After discussing this with a number of members, and raising the matter at Management Committee, it has been decided that in future, in early December we hold a one or two day sale/mini show — no judging or prizes — owner sells own plants and handles their own cash — no commission but a five dollar per table fee. More about this as time progresses. Proposed 2015 dates 12/13 December or week later !?!

At last meeting I mentioned the vandalism to our water supply, and a pending Insurance claim. It just happened that Council replaced our faulty meter a few days before that so with a new one we could accurately assess consumption (including that wasted) over three weeks at 17.5Kl. - the council charges us 73¢ per Kl., so water wasted would cost less than fifty dollars. Repairs to pipe were \$110, so not counting all of my time and trouble, overall cost is less than

our insurance excess of \$200, consequently no insurance claim.

We have also spent some time and a possible \$1500 updating our P.A. System to conform to new regulations. More about this at a meeting. T.O.S. Inc. troubles give no rest to the wicked unfortunately, but someone's "gotta do it." Meanwhile back to my comments. I've even taken time to make a key board, so that, in future when the electricity supply trips the switch, the keys for our meter box will be easier to locate.

Now the calendar – Jean will only be printing a one sheet calendar/information sheet this year because last year (and those before) took days (weeks) to make but only a few sold at a reasonable price. When you get your sheet you will note that the Management Committee has changed the meetings for Novice New Growers and General meeting to the fourth Sunday of each month except December.

Previously the Novices met on the Sunday after the fourth Friday, which led to a lot of confusion – fourth Sunday of month for a six month's trial, okay – should go well.

Also Christmas in July Dinner which has been held in conjunction with our July General Meeting will most likely be held on 31st July, the Friday after our meetings (to be confirmed).

The Novice/New Growers Group Christmas Luncheon seemed to please, and I trust that all enjoyed it as much as we did. Hope you had a wonderful Festive Season – looking forward to seeing you all in the New Year, as bright as ever, if not brighter.

We are about to start a possible new phase for the Orchid Society, from the January meeting, members will see an enlarged display of plants, this will accommodate, the normal Sunday afternoon group and the combined General meeting.

As the meeting is scheduled to start at 1 pm <u>ALL plants will</u> need to be benched No LATER THAN 12.30-12.45 PM.

I am aware that some members may not wish to have their plants judged, arrangements will be made to accommodate such an event, however there are a lot of pluses in having plants judged, allocated for points add up to prizes at the end of the year. There is also the added possibility of a plant qualifying for an award, either to the plant or to the grower (Cultural).

There will be four (4) sections for plants... Novice.. Open... Veterans... Species.., I will be on hand to assist those who are willing to enter this new phase. There are 4 coloured tags (FOR POPULAR VOTE) supplied by the Society (one for each section), these tags ALONG WITH YOUR MEMBERSHIP NUMBER will need to go into each pot MAKING TWO TAGS IN EACH POT. When the results appear, both numbers will assist in identifying winners of the sections on the scribe sheets and will be published in the February Club magazine. (it is amazing how voting slips can end up in wrong containers and alters the results). Ice cream containers with the Section printed on the outside will be placed in front of each section... can any member help me with another 6 containers please? Lids not necessary.

I am hoping for a very large display of flowers, however much as I hate to say it would members please limit the number of plants brought in , please select you best and 2nd best. There probably will be plenty of room but for the first time play it by ear.

I look forward to being of assistance to members at the January Meeting.

In Noel's Bush House 30

Cattleya tigrina A. Rich 1848

This is the oldest name (therefore the one now recognised) for the orchid which has been known for a long time as *Cattleya guttata var. leopoldii* (guttata – from the Latin word guttattus "spotted", leopoldii – named after King Leopold II , the 19th Century ruler of Belgium). Tigrina means "striped or spotted like a tiger". It is native to southern Brazil, in coastal areas (often swamps) below 300m altitude.

Cattleya tigrina is a robust bifoliate Cattleya, bearing two large leaves (although many plants have three leaves!) and can grow to have pseudobulbs up to a metre long. It is easily grown in Townsville, as the natural home in Brazil is described as "having a distinct rainy season followed by a long period of dry sunny weather" (hmmm, sounds familiar). It needs a dry spell during the winter, which will assist flowering in summer. It needs bright light and enjoys a frequent drink (and frequent fertilizer) while growing.

Many people are confused about the differences between *C. tigrina* and *C. guttata*. They are: *C. tigrina* flowers from green sheaths, as opposed to dry sheaths in *C. guttata*; it carries more (smaller) flowers, up to 30; and flowers in mid to late summer, while *C. guttata* flowers in autumn.

This is one of my favourite Cattleya species (though I love them all) and this year it graced us with its beautifully perfumed flowers over the Christmas period.
