

In Noel's Bush House 33

Guarianthe aurantiaca (Dressler & W.E. Higgins 2003) Formerly called *Cattleya aurantiacum* [Bateman ex Lindley] P.N. Don 1840

If you read my article in last month's newsletter, you will already know the colour of this orchid.
The glossy, vibrant colour stands out in any display, and it is the colour which has made this orchid such a popular choice for hybridisers. At last count (thank you, OrchidWiz) it was the parent of 287 first generation offspring, with a total of 4,470 orchid hybrids having Gua. aurantiaca in their lineage. I will name just a few of the famous orchids which have Gua. aurantiaca as a

parent: Grt. Why Not, Ctt. Jewel Box, Ctt. Chocolate Drop, Ctt. Rojo and Ctt.

Chit Chat, all of which are quality, desirable plants (and there are 282 more to choose from).

As with all of the genus Guarianthe (which also includes Guarianthe bowringiana, patinii and skinneri), *Gua.* aurantiaca was separated from the genus Cattleya in



2003, the first of the actions which has seen many of the Cattleya family of orchids renamed. Curses on you,

interfering botanist revisionists!

It comes from Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras and Nicaragua at an altitude of 300m to 2000m in mountain rain forests. The climate has an extended dry period (which paradoxically still has high humidity from dew), followed by a long wet season. In cultivation, the plant needs high humidity and lots of water during the growing season, but must have time for the roots to dry before the next drink. Repotting must wait until the appearance of new root growth. If disturbed at the wrong time, many bifoliate Cattleyas seem to sulk until they finally expire.

Be careful when buying this plant. There are several forms of this species, some being very vigorous with numerous larger flowers. However, some forms do not open widely, some being truly cleistogamous, that is, self-pollinating. It is very frustrating to grow a plant from seedling size for several years to find it does not open when flowering.

I have found this is one of the more difficult of the Gaurianthe/Cattleya species to coax to flower, probably because I have been offhand about watering it. It has one of the smallest flowers of the Cattleya family, but it is a pleasure to see the delightful cluster of flowers in full bloom.

For those who did not read that article, I was talking about *Vanda aurantiaca*, and aurantiaca means 'orange'.

20th Australian Orchid Council Conference & Show – Mackay 2015



The AOC conference provides an opportunity for orchid lovers from all parts of Australia to meet and enjoy spectacular orchid displays and learn from world-leaders in orchid breeding and culture. The AOC conference is a triennial event, held in a different state of Australia every three years. It will be the first time that the AOC conference has been held in Mackay and only the second time that a conference has been held in tropical Queensland. The 2015 event will also be the first time that the AOC conference has been combined with a major regional Orchid Conference. Additionally, foliage and allied plants will be included in the show schedule for the first time.
