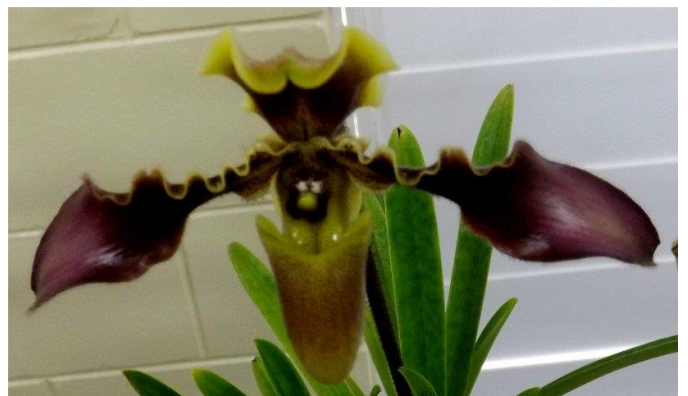

Novice/New Growers Report:- It was a hot and humid day on Sunday 25th October for the monthly meeting of the Novice/New Growers group at the Townsville Orchid Society Inc. Hall, Charles Street, Kirwan with 69 members plus 5 visitors in attendance. Thank goodness for air-conditioning as we were able to enjoy all our afternoon's activities in comfort.

Ted was our Guest Speaker on that day, speaking on Tillandsia. Ted had a variety of plants to show our members ranging from a large size plant to the smallest plant that he has in his collection. Ted made mention that there were over 750 plus 4 protected types of Tillandsia plants known to exist. They are commonly known as air plants, easy to grow in pots or mounted on cork or slabs of timber, multiply by seed or propagation and growing in well ventilated areas. Thanks Ted for your knowledgeable explanation on this subject. Jeff showed a community pot of phalaenopsis plants growing in sphagnum moss that he had only removed from a flask in April, that was now producing several spikes of pink flowers on the small plants. In Noel's Bush House 40

Vanda Golden Doubloon R.F. Orchids 1982
It is not often that I write an article about a hybrid orchid, as I have a strong interest in tropical orchid species (and I have many to write about) but I find Vanda Golden Doubloon very attractive. It is a

primary hybrid between two Vanda species, *Vanda denisoniana* and *Vanda tessellata*. It was named in 1982 by R.F. Orchids, a large orchid nursery in Florida, USA, operated by a well-known orchid grower and hybridizer, Robert Fuch. *Vanda denisoniana* is found in Burma, Thailand and China (in south-western Yunnan Province), and was named in 1869. It grows in primary montane forests at moderate altitudes.

Vanda tessellata is the type species for the Vanda genus – the species that all other Vanda species are measured against – and has been known and grown for a long time, being named in 1830. It is found in Sri Lanka, India, Nepal and Burma, and grows in warm and humid tropical forests. As the name indicates, it imparts floral tessellations (a pattern of geometric shapes) to all its hybrid progeny.

I find Vanda Golden Doubloon is relatively easy to grow. It needs as much light as it can be given in your bush house (it should not be grown in full sun). If you do not have a bush house, it should be placed in bright indirect light with an easterly aspect if possible, facing the rising sun. It should be given half-strength

fertilizer frequently, and it loves a drink of water, like all Vandas. Avoid watering the upper portion of the plant, as crown rot can kill it.

Plants are usually grown in hanging, slotted pots filled with a very open, chunky, fast draining medium.



In deference to one of the parents (*Vanda denisoniana*), the roots should not be trimmed, as they need to grow and hang down as far as they choose. Growers of *Vanda denisoniana* have found that anything more than minimum root trimming can set that plant back 2 – 3 years, so I take no chances, and do not trim the roots. Other growers know I do not trim the roots of any of my Vandas until they are very, very dead and then only for show presentation.

The plant is not affected by many pests, although thrips can do damage to the flowers, and the leaves can be attacked by spider mites. Treatment for both pests is recommended, especially before the Townsville Orchid Society shows.
