#### **Ted Boon President**

Novice/New Growers Report: - At our last Novice/ New Growers meeting on the 28<sup>th</sup> February held in the Townsville Orchid Society Inc. Hall, Charles Street, Kirwan we welcomed 69 members and 3 visitors. As the weather in Townsville over the last few months has been very hot and humid, the right type of conditions for those certain types of pests that will attack our orchid plants during this time. Some of the pests that were discussed were the Mealy Bugs, Aphids, Thrips, Red Spider and White Fly, also the tell-tale signs and some of the remedies required to combat these nasty creatures before they cause too much havoc in your bush house. It is very important to monitor your plants regularly by checking under the leaves, flowers etc. and to practice prevention by having a clean and tidy orchid house.

Lyn Mulch spoke about her box of orchid plants brought along to the meeting for the members to see. Robert broke up a Phalaenopsis plant and replanted it in a mixture of jumbo perlite and small (Gravel) stone. The gravel is placed in the bottom of pot to help stabilise the pot and a cover of stone on top to prevent the discolouration (Algae) of the perlite on top. He also showed a photo of his Phally house where all the plants were neatly arranged all in a row on a sheet of slanted wire mesh. Finally Noel had a slide show on Brazilian species cattleya orchids with a commentary on their growing habits, area location and rainfall. We have to thank all our members who are always prepared to help out at out monthly meetings. We still need more people to go on the bus to Ingham on the 10<sup>th</sup> April for the Ingham Field Day so how about asking some of your friends who might like to go and enjoy a day's outing. We have to thank also all our members for the sandwiches and delicious cakes they brought along for the afternoon tea table and for generously supporting the afternoon Multi Raffle Table. Please remember that our next meeting is on the third Sunday (20<sup>th</sup> March) this month and not on Easter Sunday.

#### In Noel's Bush House 43

<u>Dendrobium lasianthera</u>, J. J. Sm. 1932 This is a large, robust epiphyte, perhaps the most spectacular species of the Dendrobium section Spatulata (also called Ceratobium), with pseudobulbs (canes) growing up to 3 metres long. Like *Dendrobium lasianthera*, most Spatulata Dendrobiums have twisted petals and a three-lobed lip. It is found on the north coast of New Guinea on either side of the border between Iran Jaya and Papua New Guinea, along rivers and in swamp forests. It also grows along the May River, a tributary of the Sepik River, which gives rise to the names of two popular varieties – May River Red and Sepik Blue. Good luck if you want to see this orchid in its natural home, as the habitat is protected by crocodiles and leeches.



<u>Dendrobium lasianthera</u>, J. J. Sm. 1932 I was given this plant as part of a Townsville Orchid Society "Growing Competition" in October, 2010. (Is yours still growing?). Initially I was doubtful of my skill at growing it to flowering size, as I gave away most of my Dendrobium plants several years ago to make room for (you guessed it) more Vandaceous orchids, and my growing conditions, I thought, would not suit *Den. lasianthera*. Luckily, I was given some tips on growing it – I should hang the plant near the roof of my bush house for more light, not keep it on a bench, and like many Dendrobiums, it likes to have its roots crammed into a small pot.

The word Dendrobium comes from two Ancient Greek words, 'dendros' which means tree, and 'bios' life. The meaning of 'lasianthera' is 'having wooly pollinia'. I have looked closely at several flowers, but I have not seen that characteristic – perhaps I need a microscope.

This large plant needs lots of room in your bush house, as it can grow into a large clump. The climate of its New Guinea home is hot and extremely humid with year round rainfall. In seasonal floods, the roots of some plants have been seen to be covered by water for short periods without damage. It is best grown in a small pot with extremely well drained medium. It should be watered and given fertilizer throughout the year and grown in bright light. It will not grow without heat outside the tropics. Noel Grant, March 2016
