I am writing this a week after the start of an exciting TQOC Conference and Orchid Spectacular weekend, which all too soon has come and gone. What a weekend that was, and how pleasing to see a huge cavernous empty stadium area on the Thursday being completely filled by a vast array of orchids and foliage plants, as well as the very large sales area crammed with orchid vendors and associated products. It is a shame some members were unable to attend and witness this special event, an event which will not be repeated in the foreseeable future. I went to the lecture rooms which overlooked the area and took many photos of the area, which looked quite spectacular.

To all members who assisted over the week end - thank you, thank you, thank you. You deserve to be proud of yourselves for the time and assistance given. All contacts I had over the weekend were very positive about the event. I think a lot of us were on a high during the weekend. I have been to a lot of TQOC Conferences over the years, and this one was special. I am so pleased we had the assistance of the Townsville Art Society, who put on a fabulous display in the foyer, with various art pieces throughout the orchid show, and the Bonsai group, who displayed some very choice specimens. Both groups gave demonstrations to the public. We also had a whimsical table display from Kevin Butler (Ezi-Gro Orchids) of Cymbidium flowers in black hats.

The display which caused a lot of emotion for me was the display from NSW, which was set up by 2 people, of a wide variety of differing orchid genera, cut flowers and large plants, including Cymbidiums which I had been trying to source for weeks. All came to Townsville in a fully laden car. It was a remarkable sight. It certainly beat the display NSW put on at the 2015 AOC Inc./TQOC Inc Conference in Mackay.

Congratulation to Robyn and Ruth and their band of assistants, their display was worthy of any prize in southern competitions. Well done, it certainly drew a lot of favourable comments.

I must also thank Ann Hardy who went to meet our American lecturer at the airport, then went and collected our Patron Phyllis Merritt on the Sunday, brought her to the show and at the end of the visit returned her to the RSL home in Rowes Bay! Thanks a million, Ann.

To all our Lecturers - sincere thanks. I missed all the lectures, so I don't know how well they were received ("very well by all who attended!" -The Editor.). I never heard anything negative, apart from us running 2 lectures at the same time, though other conferences have 3 -4 running at the same time. I hope this Conference and Orchid Show will be remembered for a long time by all who were involved!

It would be remiss of me if I did not thank the TOS Committee for their diligence and demanding work involved in organising this event. I must single Jeff out for the tremendous amount of work he did on the Computer, it was a fantastic job, I thank him for that work.

I am aware the Sponsors will not read this, but I really must thank them for their valued support: Townsville City Council, Professional Plumbing Services, Townsville Rentals, Flintstones, Lamberts, TrueValue Aitkenvale, Banjo Paterson Motel, Billabong Motel, Monte Carlo Motel, Day Dawn Nursery, Bunnings to name but a few. Those members who exhibited plants probably retained the "trident" sticks used for tagging the plants. TOS can reuse these in the future, so please hand them in at the next meeting.

Three of our members were successful in gaining Champion status: Robyn Dundas won Champion 'Any Other Foliage' and I won Champion 'Any Other Flowering Foliage'. **Charlie Truscott gained Reserve Champion Plant of the Show.** Congratulations, Charlie!

Others who won placings in the various orchid categories were Bruno, Greg, Kerry, Warren, Jeff and Alison, Noel, Mark, Stephen Hinds, "Uncle" Fred, Jean, Carl, Terry and me. This is a good result for local members, considering plants were exhibited from as far away as New South Wales.

Foliage winners included Ron Hilder, Lynn, Warren, the Cairns Family, Robyn and me. The only sour note from the weekend **was some light-fingered persons (perhaps a member of the public) stole 3 plants I know of.** I lost a brand new Tolumnia I had purchased on the Friday, when I put a 'display only' sign on and placed it amongst the other smaller Oncidiums on the table. Terry and an exhibitor from Mackay also lost a plant. **To whoever lifted them, may karma hit you where you have never been hit before.**

When you arrive for the next meeting, you will no longer be using those disgusting fabric covered chairs. After we arrived back from collecting items from the Stadium, we marked the 150 new tables with "Townsville Orchid Society "and stored them, then turned our attention to the chairs. All badly damaged and uncleanable chairs were disposed of; I think we ended up with about 10 still useable, so now we have extra room. Don't forget the "old" tables at the hall. If you would like a **free** table (or several), please advise at the June meeting. We will need them to be collected ASAP after the June meeting.

We are going to use the plastic chairs for the time being - Jeff took one home to see if they can be scrubbed clean. We may purchase new chairs, but that will be up to the Committee. We may be able to submit another application for assistance from the Gambling Benefit Fund to buy new chairs.

At the June meeting, we will need numbers for our "Christmas in July" dinner (lunch-time at the July meeting), and a decision if you want to have plants displayed and judged at that meeting.

The time is rapidly approaching when we need to work out the winners of the various sections in our monthly competitions. Could members give some thought to the sort of trophy they would like awarded, e.g. a trophy, a gift voucher from e.g. Bunnings, perhaps a subscription to Orchids Australia magazine or an orchid book... we can have a discussion at the June Meeting.

Once again, I am asking for suggestions on what members would like discussed at the meetings... is anyone interested in Orchid perfumes? Or Oncidiums? I have a few notes I can speak on. Please let us know.

Again, our sincere thanks and congratulations for all your assistance at the TQOC Conference and Orchid Spectacular. It is indeed appreciated and you should all be proud of your input. **Thank you all.**




