Tabled Plants at Townsville Orchid Society's Monthly Meetings

Some newer Members have indicated that they are unsure of the rules when tabling flowering plants at our meetings. I hope the following will clear any doubts:

Members are encouraged to display their flowering orchid plants, or cut flowers where plants are too large for convenient transport, at each of our General Meetings, held on the fourth Sunday of every month except November (our Christmas Lunch) and December. The plants are divided into 4 sections – Novice, Open, Species and Veteran (although the Veteran section is currently not operating). Members compete for an annual award given to the owner with the highest points for each section and for the highest aggregate for the year (points in the Member's section plus Species). Awards are usually given at our November meeting.

Each tabled plant must have a label showing both the plant name (or one saying 'Unknown') and the Member's allocated Society number (please place this number on the rear of the label). A register is kept for each section, and Members must list their plants in the appropriate register, with their Society number. **If a list is not supplied, no points are awarded!** Plants must be in a clean, healthy condition and, for points to be awarded, must have been owned for at least 6 months. If you have a flowering plant which you have owned for less than 6 months but are keen to display, a "Not for Judging" sign should be attached. We trust you to be honest. Pots should be clean and undamaged. If your plant is top-heavy, please place it in a larger pot with some stones to prevent it toppling.

Within each section, plants are placed into appropriate classes, e.g. Cattleya, Dendrobium, Vanda etc. If there are fewer than 3 plants per class, they may be grouped in a 'miscellaneous' class. Points are allotted as follows:

- Members are given 1 point for each presented plant in each Section, to a maximum of 10 points per Section, so you can earn up to 20 points per meeting if, for instance, you present 10 plants in the Novice Section and 10 plants in the Species Section. These points are calculated from the lists placed in each register, so **don't forget to bring your list**! Please remember you are not restricted to bringing 20 plants if you have more in flower!
- 2. After judging, winning plants are given: 3 points for 1st in class, 2 points for 2nd and 1 point for 3rd.

The combination of the points per section for presented plants (1) and for judging (2) are recorded for the monthly Points Table. The highest aggregate for the year (e.g. Open points plus Species points) is also calculated from these points.

If the above still confuses you, please have a word to any of our senior members, who are always happy to clarify.

Here's to many beautiful plants at our meetings each month! Noel Grant

My Annual Lament

It happens every Christmas/New Year period – I have a number of plants in flower, that only flower during this period, that nobody else in the Townsville Orchid Society has a chance to appreciate. No doubt there are others who have similar plants.

There are three plants that spring to mind, that everyone would definitely want to see:

Cattleya araguaiensis – you may have seen a photo in the January newsletter from the Nightcliff Orchid Society, sent to you recently (if you have email). The unusual name refers to this orchid growing near the Araguaia River, in Brazil.

Stereochilis erinaceus – what was I doing when this lovely, unusual miniature was flowering? I must have been very busy, because I failed to take a photo for you. Check it out on OrchidWiz or Google it. The pervasive warty extrusions fascinate me.

Rhynchostylis coelestis – a very famous orchid, used extensively in hybridisation. I used to have 9 of them, but It seems I have killed a few. Hoorah, I have a photo! Noel Grant
