### The President's Comments

- Greg Kelly thanked Charles Lee for the work he has done in the past two years in the role as Talks Coordinator. Charles stood up when no-one else would do it. Got it organised. He put a lot of time into preparing lectures, trying to address all levels of knowledge of members. A round of applause was given.
- Greg Kelly mentioned Charles Lee's slide presentation from last month which highlighted the way the Sunday meeting has evolved over the years. He acknowledged the difficulty in finding balance between the needs of members and the need for a formal meeting each month.
- Greg Kelly called for any interest in assuming the role of Talks Coordinator. No response. At the Management Meeting, Committee discussed how we could meet the needs of the members and what topics would be appropriate. Roles of some speakers were clarified.
  - ✓ Peter Lucke (technical advisor) will address orchid problems that are raised. He will call on others for their opinions.
  - ✓ Charlie Truscott and Ted Boon will explain what makes a good plant.
  - ✓ Charlie Truscott will speak about pests and insecticides at our next meeting.
- Field Days lists for Ingham and Bowen are on the table at the front of the Hall. Costs are on the list. This does not include the cost of the lunch supplied.
  - ✓ Historically the Ingham bus is fuller than the Bowen bus. Not a concern.
  - ✓ Bowen bus is \$40 (not including lunch) for the big bus. Need 25 minimum for big bus to be booked.
  - ✓ Places on buses are not ensured until monies are paid. Pay first first priority.
  - ✓ Our Treasurer would prefer people to pay by electronic transfer. Details are on the website and in the bulletin.
- Janelle Stevens Mobile Travel agent is willing to put together a travel package for the 14<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Orchid Conference 2022. Members expressed interest.
- Warren Sewell asked if it was possible to make more disability carparks as one is not enough for our aging and disabled members. Solutions will be investigated.
- Lyn Mutch going out of orchids and has about 150 to sell. See Lyn.

• Ted Boon thanked people for the visits and help given to him since being diagnosed with his illness - John Johnson has cared for Ted's orchids and thinks it would be beneficial to form a group to help people out.


### Talks:

- Charlie Truscott spoke on 'Alice's Anie' explained that judges look for shape firstly, then the colour and texture.
- Species spoke about Ctsm expansum 'Myra' HCC/AOS x Ctsm expansum 'Linda' AM/AOS and the interesting fact that individual plants of this genus produce either male or female flowers – this one has male flowers.
- Awarded 77 points to Vanda Unknown Janelle Stevens. Both Charlie and Ted believe it can be identified by its colour, shape and fragrance as Vanda Kulwadee Fragrance.
- Ted showed members the proper 'Dove Orchid' Peristeria elata from Panama.
- Peter Lucke explained that the heat is knocking flowers about so very few Cattleya are in flower. Vandas love the heat. By the Autumn Show, Cooktown orchids should be in abundance. Welcoming rain is flushing plants out. From now to Winter is not the time to repot. Start staking new inflorescences to train them to straighten the flowers.
- Ted Boon presented AOC awards: Peter Cooper awarded a highly commended certificate; Charlie Truscott – got a first-class certificate, which requires over 85 points - Dendrobium from the September Show.
- Reg Dix did a presentation on naming orchids -
  - ✓ how names are written on tags e.g. italics or underlined for species
  - ✓ registered with RHS Kew. Some imported orchids have not been registered with RHS.
  - $\checkmark$  explained what a mericlone is.
  - ✓ spoke about how to use OrchidWiz.
- Rex Dix, Greg Kelly and Noel Grant have OrchidWiz and are available if members have enquiries about orchid names.
- Members were reminded that the Orchid Society has an updated copy of OrchidWiz on the Society's computer. It will be set up at the back of the Hall after each General Meeting for members to use.
