The President's Comments

Fortnightly Zoom Meeting for all members

A virtual meeting was held on Sunday 28th June, when we were entertained with a talk from a representative of Neutrog, a well-known fertiliser company, and members of the Australian Orchid Council, who gave a presentation about the AOC Conference, to be held in Brisbane in September, 2021. Various members displayed flowering orchids for our pleasure and questions about orchid problems were answered.

During the Zoom meeting on Sunday 31 May, a member enquired if anybody knew how to kill military fern in their bush house. Thanks to Noel Grundon for this article in the February 2020 newsletter of the North Queensland Orchid Society Inc, Cairns:

Control of Military Fern

In the December 2019 newsletter of NQOS-Cairns, I wrote an article on controlling a weed I have great problems in killing – military fern (*Pilea mcirophylla*) that is not a fern. Although the article listed a weedicide that would kill this weed, I did not know where to buy small quantities of it. I have now found a source.

But first a summary of the previous article. Military fern is also known as artillery weed, rockweed, or gun-powder plant. It is a common weed in my bush-house and is very difficult to remove from potted orchids. Hand weeding often leaves small pieces of rhizome behind that quickly re-sprout. It produces large amounts of fine seed that seem to explosively spread throughout the growing area – into pots and under benches. Some people grow it as a groundcover under their benches but it can quickly spread into pots.

While I have been able to control all other major weeds in my orchid pots by spraying or painting the weed with Roundup (Active Ingredient = Glyphosate) at the recommended strength, I have found that Roundup does not kill military fern (nor for that matter does it kill mature plants of the many orchid genera I grow). Roundup generally sets military fern plants back with yellowing and a slowdown of growth, however it is usually a short-term set-back and the plant resumes growth after a while.

Conover and Stamps₁ found that the herbicide Ronstar 50 WP (Active Ingredient = Oxadiazon) gave complete control for up to 8 weeks after application of foliar sprays at the recommended rates on the packet. I have not been able to find small quantities of a weedicide that contains Ronstar but I have been able to kill military fern using Brunnings (note not Bunnings) Path Weeder that contains Simazine (36.9 g/L), Amitrole (20.5 g/L) and Ammonium Thiocyanate (18.0 g/L) obtained from Big W Atherton.

Recommendations:

The take-home message would seem to be that if you wish to remove military fern from potted orchids, hand weeding is the safest method that may cause the least damage to your orchids. If you wish to kill military fern under your benches, Brunnings Path Weeder will kill this weed and every other weed under your benches. **Do not apply this weedicide to your potted orchids. My bet is that it will kill the orchid also.**



Note from the Editor: I found some at Big W, Castletown and have since seen it at Bunnings. Please use with great caution in your bush house! I trimmed all vanda roots and took all pots from the floor. You will need to be patient, as it took several weeks for any results to be seen, but now my bush house floor has no military fern! Noel Grant.
