The President's Comments

Tabling of plants at monthly meetings.

 - > Better to take any old inflorescences off a plant when displaying it for the show as the whole plant is judged.
 - > Dendrobium abbreviation should be Den. not De.
 - ➤ Vandas need to be upright Reg will show how to make a Vanda grow upright.
- 12. Charlie Truscott. Technical advisor
 - Clarifying some information about Iron Chelate use 20g per litre for orchids not what is on the back of label. Iron makes plant colour more vivid.
 - Reg Iron Chelate When mixing it up, store in a dark wine bottle to prevent it from turning green.
 - Can mix with fertilisers.
 - Growth formula combination of two plant hormones +B1. Promotes strong root growth. Add
 to normal fertilising program. Use just 1ml per litre. Put in water when propagating plants.
 From Alice or Fernland or Burdekin Growers in Ayr. Makes plants more resistant to this –
 Once per month.
 - Mancozeb will not kill disease more of a raincoat.
 - Johnsons remedy Reg has the recipe for it.
 - Distressed plants need glucose to revive.
 - Product Zaleton broad spectrum fungicide. Useful in wet weather when plants are suffering.

• • • Back in 2004 Robert's date slice that was on the smoko table was soooooo tasty that he was convinced to publish the recipe in the TOS Bulletin.

ROBERT'S DATE SLICE.

Melt 250 grams butter; add 2/3 cup castor sugar and stir until dissolved. Add 500 grams chopped pitted dates and simmer until soft, 4 to 5 minutes. Remove from heat and add 1 well beaten egg and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Break 1 packet Marie biscuits into small bits and add to the mixture. Press into a lamington tray (or something similar) and refrigerate until set. Cut into small squares and roll in coconut. Store in the refrigerator. Thanks Robert.

BUT PLEASE! PLEASE! DON'T EVERYONE ARRIVE WITH THE SAME 'PLATE' THE MORE VARIETY – THE TASTIER!

• • Back in the 1970s/80s there were not many, if any, fertilisers made for the orchid grower. As a result, there emerged many home remedies often based on the modification of fertilisers marketed for the veggie patch or lawn.

One such recipe that was given to us many, many years ago is:

To your Aquasol solution (at whatever dilution you normally use) add 1g/10L of Iron Chelate in powder form and 2g/10L Magnesium Sulphate (Epson salts). Dissolve well before applying. (Note: 10L was the approximate volume of a normal watering can.)

Iron Chelate and Magnesium Chelate

Interest was sparked among members at the January meeting when Charlie Truscott spoke on the benefits of including Iron Chelate and Magnesium Chelate with our orchid fertiliser program. The interest continued at the February meeting when he was again bombarded with questions about chelates. I am sure many of us are now using these products, as I am.

I am interested in orchid names and their meanings, and I have a minor knowledge of the origins of many words. A 'chelate' is a type of bonding of ions and molecules to metal ions (according to Google), and has its origin in the Greek language.

In Greek, 'ch' is pronounced 'k', as in chemist, **not** as in cheese.

Therefore, chelate is pronounced 'key late'.
