I have often said that I walk through my greenhouse most days. From afar, something was amiss with one of my Cattleya flowers recently. On closer inspection I found that one of the petals had

been severed. I could find no remains. I could find no trace of grasshoppers in the greenhouse so I am guessing that a rat has had a midnight snack on the flower. I have only had this happen once before in over 33 years growing orchids, so I hope it is an isolated incident. When I was in Brisbane earlier in the year, I visited a greenhouse where the owner had about 45 phalaenanthe dendrobiums that had been attacked by rats with big gaps in just about every flower spike. This happened a week before his local orchid show! I am lucky to have lost only one flower.

 - He suggested mixing Alginox with your inorganic fertilisers to prevent this. It is a good wetting agent. Can be purchased at Pool suppliers. Burdekin Farmers sell Path-X or SteriMax which does the same job.
 - Question 1: When do you start repotting Cats? Answer: Now. Charlie soaks plants and pots in Alginox for about 10 minutes to ensure there is no transference of disease.
 - Question 2: When should keikis be cut off the original plant? Answer: When it gets a second growth and roots cut it off and pot it.

Notes from "Phaelanopsis - species to hybrid to award winners."

Jeff commenced his presentation with some interesting history regarding the finding and naming of the Phaelanopsis orchids. He showed an early definition of the plant.

PHALAENOPSIS AMABILIS - INDIAN BUTTERFLY PLANT

The generic name is derived from the Greek PHALAINA, a moth, and OPSIS, resemblance. An epiphyte which displays bold foliage and flowers, but is devoid of gaiety. Should be grown in moss, attached to decaying wood.

We saw pictures of the phalaenopsis hybrids that were awarded an AM or FCC in Australia – the first in 1965 and progressively more in the following decades. It was noted that until the 1990's all awarded flowers were white.

In 1993, our own TOS member (technical advisor) Charlie Truscott won an AM/A0C with Phal. Carmela's Wonder 'Sharon'.

Our Society was also well represented in the 2000s with awarded flower. It was also noted that Charlie Truscott has the only AOC award for Phaelanopsis.

Jeff gave hints as to how he and Alison grow their Phaelanopsis orchids.

- Medium sphagnum moss
- Pots squat and otherwise
- Moisture keep sphag moist (3 waterings a week in Summer, once a week in Winter, am), misters take care not to allow water to lie around in the middle of the plant as it can cause bacterial rot.
- Fertilise regular (weekly, variety of fertilisers) (Phallies take up 85% of water and nutrient requirements through their roots).
- Repot by December each year (cut flowers off)
- Solid roof
- Light aim for <1500fc
- Pests false spider mites, botrytis, root rot, bacterial rot
- Pest control variety prevention is better than cure.
- Staking Aluminium wire and clips

Jeff finished off with this comment:

Many orchid flowers are nice, but ... Phalaenopsis orchid flowers are a class above the rest.





"Club Shop Jottings"

August 2021 Meeting.

A few interesting bits of information:

- 1. We will be **placing an order with** *Fernland* after this meeting. Read the *Fernland* catalogue on the information table and at the shop and write your orders in the book at the shop. Talk to us about your wish list, including "Kiwi" bark you need now or in the reasonable future as we can order extras. Goods should be here at the September meeting, all ready for your mammoth repotting effort. Talk to us at the shop with your questions.
- 2. Check out this short informational YouTube video from Fernland detailing a **new natural insecticide**, Sero-X. (Yes, we can order whole bottles of this for you.) Copy this link and paste it into a web browser → <u>Sero-X Natural Insecticide YouTube</u>
- 3. The members' sales table is increasing in popularity. My observations are,
 - a. It is for orchid plants in flower.
 - b. Sellers must remember that you are selling to fellow orchid growers, so only quality orchids should be there.
 - c. Members buying usually bring the plant to the shop as their first point of contact, especially if there is a TOS barcode on the pot. However, the sell/buy process happens directly between the seller and the buyer. The shop is NOT involved, nor does the TOS receive any commission or donation.
 - d. Selling members should ensure their name is on the sale plant so the buyer can track you down and give you the cash.
- 4. We are trying to **upskill members**, as required, who are on the show roster as cashiers, by having them practice using the cash register at the shop during the meeting. Please be patient.
- 5. We have sold out of the secateur's steriliser (**Trisodium phosphate**). I found a product "tricleanium" (on Mitre 10 webpage for example) which contains 99% Trisodium phosphate, so it will do the same job.
