Charlie Truscott discussed Phosphoric Acid and its benefits in counteracting Crown/Root and Stem Rot in Phalaenopsis and Root/Collar and Stem Rot in other ornamentals. Can add to fertilisers with no problems

or reactions as a preventative measure. Check pH of water being used, council water is 7.2, adding acid will bring it closer to 5.5 to 6.5 as preferred by orchids. Noel's vanda which had had crown rot, treated with fungicide, reshot below and continued growing, luckily. Terry has had success in treating with cinnamon. Mancozeb is a good spray to act as a 'raincoat' as a preventative, but if rot has set in use the acid as a treatment to eradicate.

Aerides odorata - Philippines form

Aerides odorata was describes by Joao de Loueiro in 1790. As the first species described, it is the type species of the genus and the entire subtribe Aeridinae (plants in this group are commonly called vandaceous). It has the widest distribution of any of the Aeridinae, ranging from eastern India, Nepal and Bhutan through most of Indochina, Malaysia, Indonesia, south to Timor and east to the Philippines. Over such a wide area of the planet, it is not surprising that many colour variations occur.

Typical forms of *Aerides odorata* are pure creamy white with pale rosy lilac patches at the distal ends of the sepals and petals and the midlobe of the lip. In some forms, the lilac colour covers the entire petal. As you can see, the Philippines form features a distinct yellow contrasting lip. Each pendulous inflorescence supports up to 40 gloriously perfumed flowers.

I bought my plant from Eric Beltrame in Ingham in 2016 during the HROAPS Field Day and it has grown well since then. It currently has 13 inflorescences and is too large, and tangled in my jungle, to bring to meetings. I own another, which has 'only' 7 inflorescences.

While researching this orchid, I checked the photographs in OrchidWiz, where I saw a photo with the caption "Aerides odorata 'Wild' ACE/AOC photography by Australian Orchid Council; grower is Benson D." I suggest you have a look to see how to REALLY grow this lovely orchid. Good work, Doug.

General Business:

- 1. OrchidWiz mail service a problem. May need to download from someone else's disc or get a code.
- 2. Greg Kelly is prepared to continue to organise the lectures for the meetings. Discussed ideas of types of lectures we could include. Need to have some simple, basic talks.
- 3. Jeff Knowles suggested that maybe we need to purchase a new data projector as it is easier for everyone to see the screen better.
 - Jan Allen mentioned a suggestion brought up on Sunday regarding selling non-flowering plants at the monthly meetings. She pointed out there is a by-law By-law 16 (1), which states "Members may sell flowering orchid plants at general meetings." Jeff Knowles mentioned that this by-law was really meant so that orchid club members could offer quality plants to other orchid club members at a reasonable price. The Committee agreed that it would get out of hand if non-flowering plants were allowed. Shows and Field Days are opportunities for members to sell plants.
- 4. We need to look at whether we could get a grant from "Stronger Communities Grants Program" to retile our floor.
- 5. Sign for show dates to be changed.
- 6. Committee agreed that If members are wanting to use the Hall commercially, then commercial rates should be charged. Lessees would need to have their own insurance.
- 7. June Cairns questioned whether it was feasible to have a 'flasking' group as they did in the past. Jeff mentioned if there were enough people interested it would be possible. Jan Allen suggested that this could become one of the "Interest groups" if there were enough people interested.

- 8. After the last meeting, it was mentioned that the Judges' cupboard was not being used but it belongs to the Judges, so we are unable to use it. Robyn Dundas would like a cupboard for Show bits and piece to be put in one place. Where to place a new cupboard proved a problem.
- 9. Robyn Dundas has bought 6 flasks for the Club. She de-flasked 4 of them and Ruth Whiting deflasked 2 of them. They will grow them up ready for new members and to be handed out to the members as agreed upon at one of the past meetings. This will happen instead of having the Plant Competition.
