

- Mancozeb can leave white marks, when spraying add green food colouring
- Fungus is a problem after all this rain, Anti-Rot available from Bunnings active ingredient Phosphoric Acid, be careful, it can alter pH
- Vandas, "Thailand Rust" bottom leaves yellow and drop off, healthy plants will have all leaves, pathogen starts as purple spots which turn brown and then black, feels like sandpaper when you run your fingers along the leaves, fungicides include Triforine, Biophentaline Methanol (BanRot)

Presentation - Jeff Knowles, "Food"

- Just like people, plants love food
- Do you grow orchids for the flowers or for the prizes/ribbons?
- Will fertiliser make a difference? yes, photos of comparison of plants grown with and without fertilising
- Some research findings: plants had a wider leaf spread, produced more and larger leaves, and had a greater total leaf area in response to being fertilised, regardless of the fertiliser used
- Just water is ok, but with fertiliser is better
- Menu main course: Macro, Minor, and Micro nutients
- Macro: Nitrogen (N), Phosphorus (P), Potassium (K)
- 20:2:6 relates to percentage contained in the fertiliser
- Read labels with care. NPK 20:8.7:16.6 in Aus, 20:20:20 in the US (usually quoted as oxides which need to break down
- N available in three forms Nitrate ions, Ammonium ions, Urea
- Nitrate ions are immediately available for uptake by the roots
- · Ammonium ions are immediately available for uptake
- Urea must be converted to ammonium ion by the enzyme urease (by living bacteria) in the orchid roots and microorganisms in the root zone
- Most orchid fertilisers will have nitrate ion and ammonium ion, and not urea because we don't have the bacteria readily available
- Ground orchids probably do have bacteria available in soil
- Minor nutrients: Calcium (Ca), Magnesium (Mg) and Sulphur (S)
- Many orchid fertilisers will not have Ca or Mg, but plants do need them
- To gain Ca, add Calcium nitrate, 1gm per L of water, don't mix with other items because it will often
 combine and form a solid and sink and not be found in the spray. Will absorb moisture from the air
 and turn into a liquid, need to reseal packet carefully after use, use once a month, again don't add it
 to anything else
- Epsom salts (Mg), this you can add to other sprays, put between half and a full teaspoon in
- Micro nutrients: TE (Trace elements): Iron (Fe), Manganese (Mn), Zinc (Zn), Copper (Cu), Boron (B), Molybdnum (Mo), many fertilisers will have trace elements
- Different orchids such as Vandas compared to Cattleya or Dendrobiums probably require some slight difference but anything you are using is better than not using it
- Growth hormones: NAA, IAA, B1 (Auxinone), Naphthalene acetic acid, Indole acetic acid and Vitamin B1 (Thiamine), 1 mg per L, often sold under a name like Growth Formula
- Use other goodies, Seaweed, Blood and bone, Fish emulsions, Worm wee, Molasses

- Molasses available from Lamberts, take care when using as it will stain flowers
- Growth promoter, Nutri-tech Black Gold, Seaweed Master, Seasol Plus, **no NPK**, need to do that separately, if it is not listed on the label it is probably not in there
- Use quite often, once a month add Seaweed Master and Molasses together
- Worm liquid, dilute to a weak tea colour
- Soluble Aspirin: Salisylic Acid is produced by injury to a plant and motivates it grow, add Solprin from chemist to assist in growth
- Plant growth laws, Liebig's Law of Minimum Growth is dictated by the amount of the scarcest nutrient, the amount available is a limiting factor. Jeff used the 'Barrel Analogy', where the barrel is constructed from slats of various heights. You can only fill the barrel to the top of the shortest slat, then the water will spill out, it will not get any fuller. So even though the plant could use more of the other nutrients, you need to increase the balance of nutrients, the lowest one, or the one missing, is the one that has greatest effect, give plants a bit of everything to try to obtain the balance
- The Three Bears Principle: not too little, not too much, just right, deficiency zone, adequate zone, toxic zone (concentration of nutrient in tissue), give it nothing and kill it, give it too much and kill it, need to be somewhere in between
- 50 to 250 ppm N most common
- Cattleyas 50 ppm N, Phalaenopsis 200 ppm N, learn to read the orchids, most use 80 ppm N to 100 ppm N
- 1g of solid fertiliser in 1L, add a zero to the N% to get the concentration of N in mixed up ready to use fertilisers eg 1gm in 1L is 100 ppm N, 2 gm in 1L is 200 ppm N, 10gm in 10L is 100 ppm
- Rule to remember 1gm in 1L
- Law 3 Suck it up Baby: Phalaenopsis absorb 85% through their roots, 15% through their leaves, roots become saturated after 15-50 seconds. Need to consider the hydrophobic nature of the roots and media, if they are really dry, water will bead and run off, need to maintain moisture if you can, photos of very dry vanda roots and a series of four waterings to turn white roots green to show they are wet.
- Law 4: pH affects uptake of nutrients: optimal pH range for most plants 5.5 to 7.0, leaning to slightly acidic from neutral not alkaline, to adjust or not to adjust? Check bore water, some fertilisers will buffer pH
- Water soluble fertiliser, dampening roots first should make roots more likely to uptake fertiliser.
 Probably not during the middle of the day, arguments for and against morning or late afternoon, will make a difference what season it is and likelihood of night time rain...
- Slow release fertilisers, you cannot control how much or how often the plants will be able to access the food
- Solid stuff flowering and fruiting compounds, not normally for orchids, tend to flush quickly and could be toxic levels
- Inorganic GF9 and/or organic eg Seasol, need to be broken down over time and require additional help to make nutrients available to plants ie bacteria
- Use a spreader? Helps to disperse water tension to allow even coverage rather than drops forming at the lower points
- Chelated nutrients have been processed to encapsulate the micro nutrient. This is then more readily
 available to the plant to uptake, they are more expensive, some would argue they are worth the
 extra cost, ethylenediaminetetraacetic acid EDTA
