## Presentation – Lyn Johnson

- Up to 30,000 different species of orchids, of which 10,000 are found in the tropics, second largest family of flowering plants on Earth. TOS aims to help you with your frustrations and the difficulties you encounter
- Why are orchids so valuable? Specialised to specific locations of origin
- You can catch a disease from orchids call “Buymoreorchiditis”!
- Noel helped with reading orchid names in collection
- Sarcochylus and other orchids difficult in Townsville because it doesn’t get cold enough
- Some discussion re history and development of orchids
- Discussion re structure of family down to species
- Most popular Genus: Cattleya, Dendrobium, Oncidium, Paphiopedilum (Slipper Orchids), Phalaenopsis, Vandas, Bulbophyllum
- Need to look at space available, and the light needed for the type
- Shadow test – put a piece of paper on the bench, place hand over the sheet, move up about a foot, if a slight shadow probably reasonable light, blurred dull shadow will indicate the light may not be bright enough
- Use technology – when you buy a new orchid, google it, and look at its requirements for water, humidity, light and nutrition
- Remember to reverse times of things like flowering if using a Northern Hemisphere website like American Orchid Society, if it says it flowers in August, here that means February
- Change watering times to early mornings in April and through winter, change to late afternoons in September
- Good fertilisers include, Thrive, Eco forms, watering and fertilising systems are available, will pass around the information sheets
- Example of how records of orchids can be kept
- If not flowering, move them around to find happier locations
- Dendrobium beetles, permethrin active ingredient, read safety instructions and wear the proper gear, deters other insects but not spider mites, they are arachnids not insects
- Potting mix – we all have ones we prefer, 2 parts of bark, 2 parts perlite, 1 part scoria
- Core peat – comes in many forms, Lyn uses the one from the block, break off and dampen to use
- Gypsum good source of calcium, dolomite is lime will change pH, has magnesium in it as well, sprinkled on the top of pots after potting
- How to tell if orchids need water, push a bamboo skewer in the pot for half an hour to an hour and if it is damp, doesn’t need water

### **In Memory of Robert Bisetto and Geoff Stocker**

At the Townsville Orchid Society's 75<sup>th</sup> Birthday Gala Orchid Show and Sales, there were many sponsorships for show champions. Two such sponsorships were by Sue Holcombe of Cape Oasis Orchids for the **Best Specimen** in memory of Robert Bisetto and for the **Champion Exotic Species** in memory of Geoff Stocker.

Unfortunately, Sue could not make the Presentation Dinner on Saturday night to talk to these awards and to present them.

We publish here her speech notes to fully honour these two gentlemen:

#### **Robert Bisetto**

Some of you here would have met or heard of Robert Bisetto. He was quite a flamboyant character but a very kind and generous person, who was passionate about species orchids, multifloral paphiopedilums and growing specimen-sized orchids, which he grew incredibly well.

Unfortunately, Robert passed away suddenly at the age of 62 years last year. He had been heavily involved with several Orchid societies in Sydney before moving to North Queensland. He would have been tickled to have a prize named in his honour.

#### **Geoff Stocker, 1941 to 2021**

Geoff was a botanical scientist with CSIRO and had a life-long interest in the orchids of South America, South East Asia and especially Papua New Guinea. He co-authored "Dendrobium and its Relatives" with Bill Lavarack and the late Wayne Harris. He had a long friendship with Phil Spence, a well-known collector and hybridizer of Papua New Guinea Dendrobium species.

*Dendrobium stockeri* and *Bulbophyllum stockeri* were named after him.

He is survived by his wife Jackie, his daughters Elise and Lucy and families.

Geoff would have been very proud to have a prize sponsored in his name for this Show.
