



- Jan discussed that if we have TQOC every three years, would need to remove one show that year to balance out demands
- Reg discussed the types of orchids and blooming times, if one was to be dropped it would make sense for it to be the Winter Show.
- Noel replied that the Winter Show was not originally held but was added to cater for enthusiasts of winter-blooming plants eg Rhynchostylis
- Charles discussed TQOC expectations, collection of revenue etc

- Jeff discussed bar codes and how the register directs individual vendor sales to separate allocations. Need to be whole dollars. Be careful, don't use old bar codes because allocations in new printing could have changed and accounting for new prices will be in error to the old
