Technical Report – Charlie Truscott

- Botritis is very common at this time of the year. Fungal disease, black spots of flowers, start small and get larger and more in number in orchid house, need to limit travelling of spores. Check plants thoroughly before bringing to the show.
- Common at this time of the year with the "Mango Winds". Dust in the wind will settle on plants and moisture will cause the fungus to take hold. Keep air moving in greenhouses and treat with Alginox. Treat the benches, leaves and pots, don't spray the flowers. 3ml per litre.
- Can add to fertilising at 1ml per litre, but do not add to organic fertilisers like Charlie Carp or Seasol. Fertilise with these first, leave for an hour or two, then spray the Alginox.
- Botritis doesn't really damage the plant, unless it gets into the plant through a cut or something like that, more that it spreads easily and unsightly on flowers, and after all that is the major reason we are growing orchids.
- Don't drop old flowers to the floor of the greenhouse, dispose of them in the rubbish bin, just to limit any possibility of spreading
- Sterimax, used by cane farmers, on all machinery is also very good, it is also an anti-viral

Presentation on Tolumnias – Greg Kelly

- Have been growing for 30 + years, and think I have figured a few things out
- Tolumnia, 32 named plant; Rodriguezia 50 named plants; Zelenkoa
- Hybrids – Rrm T x R = rodrumnia; Zlm T x Z is a zelemnia; Zgz is R x Z is a zelumguezia
- Mostly native to Caribbean area

- Plants predominately grow on the outer edges of branches
- Often throws keikeis after flowering
- Endure strong sunlight intermittently
- Received high temperatures, regular rain and high humidity in summer
- Rain often occurs in the night
- Less rain in winter but moisture obtained from dew and mist
- Plants dry out between watering
- Very colourful, take up a small area, hundreds of plants can fit into limited space
- Flower readily, some twelve months out of the flask
- Flowers start March and April and can flower until October and November
- Roots of the plant are very fine. No pseudobulbs to store moisture; this causes plants to suffer from dehydration on occasion
- Dislike low humidity like we have in July, Aug, September, will readily drop leaves if left too dry
- Some growers say that phytophthera is a problem, or small insects, I believe that it is mainly lack of water
- I pot using straight perlite. I cover the perlite with a layer of 14 mm gravel
- Recently I have planted some plants in clay balls, I like them because of the varying sizes allowing for air flow
- 100mm pots, jumbo perlite
- Irrespective of what you pot in, the mix needs to be able to dry out relatively quickly and be open enough for the roots to go down into the mix
- If roots are visible out the bottom of the pots, the mix is open enough
- Greenhouse is 70% shadecloth
- Use a second layer of shadecloth over the section where I grow my plants, for six months from October and generally remove after Anzac Day
- Water to your own conditions
- Mounted plants need more water than potted plants, hanging plants are exposed to more moving air and will dry out quicker
- I believe that they need to be watered, allowed to dry out, then water again
- In spring when heat is high and humidity is low, every second day
- Other times at least twice a week dependant on conditions
- In spring and summer water in the afternoon to give the plant the opportunity to take in the moisture
- Do not water overhead once the flower spikes show, hand water
- Plants have two growth periods in October/November and again in March/April, further south they only get the spring growth
- Size does matter, the bigger the plant the better the size, number and quality of the flower
- Plant should get a little bit bigger with each growth cycle, leaves get little bigger
- I have been fertilizing about twice a week for the past eighteen months
- I spray everything with the same product
- I use a variety of fertilisers
- Whatever I use at the start of the week, I use for that week
- I have also used slow-release fertiliser which I believe assisted in growth
- I use very small amounts, placed in the pot away from the roots, take care, will burn roots
- I rarely use fungicides because my greenhouse is so open and breezy
- I repot every year, and cull anything that is not good or performing poorly
- All plants usually repotted every three years
- In November and March plants make new growth
- Best to pot as new growth is appearing
- Prefer the end of March to repot as the heat is diminishing
- Use 70 mm to 100 mm pots only
- Usually pull the plants apart, ensuring that there is new growth
- The bigger you leave the plant the quicker the divided plants will grow
- Clean up roots and remove anything that has dropped leaves, obviously past prime

- Ensure the plant sits above the medium.
- Looking for bright, clean colour that does not bleed or face with a full skirt which is rounded with minimal splits or gaps, where the lobes of the skirt can overlap to prevent a gap appearing. No gaps between the dorsal sepal and the petals. Some say the petals should be rounded, others say points are okay
- Consistency of lower size and shape similar throughout, not reducing in size towards the end of the spike
- Displayed well on flower spike. Individual flowers easily seen. Can be side by side or around stem

Presentation by Jeff Knowles – A Tale of Two Cities

- Plant names in Latin from Greek origins
- For example: Dendrochilum (pronounced dendro ki lum) named in 1825 by Blume, comes from Greek ‘dendron’ meaning tree and ‘cheilos’ meaning lip (this being a neutral gendered word)
- Coelogyne (sounds like sel o jen e) named in 1825 by Lindley, is from ‘koilos’ meaning hollow and ‘gyne’ as the female gender.
- Species names also use adjectival epithet – *Dendrochilum cobbianum*, um being neutral
- It could also have been named cobb-i-i (after the European man who discovered it)
- Dendrochilum is now subsumed into Coelogyne. Coelogyne is female, cobbianum is neutral so therefore it will be renamed *Coelogyne cobbiana* (ana being female)
- Can check more information on World Checklist of Selected Plant Names (Kew Science)
