Technical Report – Charlie Truscott

- As weather is heating up, more pests will be present in greenhouses
- Be more vigilant at checking and spraying
- On a small collection, granular pest killer, such as Rich Gro Bug Killer, can be sprinkled on the tops of pots, it will last two to three months. Granular forms are good because they limit exposure of yourself and others to sprays, similar to Confidor, available from Fernland, buy online, works 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Also available from Burdekin Farmers, please note that it doesn't kill spider mites
- Sprinkle on, following instructions on the bottle re size of the pot, water in, treats scale, mealy bug and thrips
- Sugar Cane growers use suSCon Maxi only purchased in large quantities (15 kg), could go shares with others, will last up to six months but a few hundred dollars to purchase
- Will kill scale

Presentation on Catasetum Family – Ruth Whiting

- Grow rapidly during summer needing lots of water and lots of fertilizer
- Warm tropical orchids suited to our climate with distinct wet and dry seasons
- Bright light 50- 60% and very good air movement
- Generally go into dormancy between autumn and winter, when leaves start to yellow and fall off
- Reduce and stop watering and fertilizing, bulbs may get a little wrinkled
- Some bulbs hold leaves during throughout winter, could give a splash of water now and then for these
- Catasetums - Easy to grow, over 170 species
- Variety of colours, sizes and shapes
- Bloom from the base, 2-4 times a year, spring to autumn
- Most have arching inflorescences, have male or female flowers
- Clowesia (Clo-wes-eea)- really easy to grow and resistant to rot
- Shorter pseudobulbs, have bisexual flowers called 'perfect'
- Majority from Mexico, large flowering in summer, small flowering in winter
- Very fragrant with long life flowers, up to a month, and like to grow cramped
- Cycnoches (sikNOkeys)

- Swan orchid, more temperamental
 - Small group with only a few pseudobulbs
 - Flower from middle to upper part of bulb and can flower twice in a season
 - Male or female flower
 - Southern Mexico to Bolivia
 - Mormodes (moreM0dez)
 - Called goblin orchid
 - Bright colours with strange shapes
 - Reputation harder to grow, Mexico to Brazil and Bolivia
 - Female dominant flowers
 - Common Hybrid types include:
 - Fredclarkeara – FDK After Dark
 - Cycnodes – cycnoches x mormodes - Cycd Wine Delight
 - Catamodes – catasetum x mormodes
 - Clowesetum – clowesia x catasetum
-
- These orchids are Spider mite magnets, spray April/May for mites and again October/November
 - When repotting, clean up the pseudobulbs, strip away old sheaths where pests can hide
 - Cut away old roots, you can be quite savage with this, should be dry because they have been dormant
 - Take off old bulbs, but try to leave two together, sit in a plastic pot with a tag, often will throw a new bulb, sometimes within weeks
 - Don't over pot, but position bulbs to one side so that there is plenty of room for the new bulb to grow
 - River rock in the bottom of the pot, wet sphagnum moss, push in really tight on top of the rocks with a thin layer then sprinkle granular fertiliser, continue alternating layers to about half way up the pot, keeps fertiliser away from roots to prevent burning
 - Sit new bulbs on top, push more moss tightly around, partially up the root ball, but not up to the bulbs, need room for 5 to 6 inches of root growth
 - Once new bulbs are formed and grown roots, then pack more moss around tightly, then top with rocks

Presentation by Jeff Knowles – Brisbane Orchid Show 2023, Logan

- Jeff showed photos of champion orchids from Brisbane Show
- Discussed forms of presentation of orchids, such as black boards behind champions, aids in viewing and photographing
- Video of tour through the *Den speciosum* in the show, incredible displays, very fragrant
- Different societies had different themes for their presentations
- Interesting ideas, large upturned pot cut out base, then pot with orchid sat into the upturned base
