#### **Business arising:**

- President Robyn advised that she had obtained the flasks for the society from Mallee Phallees and was waiting for a short period before deflasking the plants.
- Robyn spoke at length regarding the meeting with the representative from the Townsville City Council. This related to the renewal of the lease on the hall. Meeting very positive with the representative Helene James indicating that the society ticked all of the areas required for renewal of the lease. Robyn continued that Helene had indicated part of her role was to help clubs obtain grants wherever possible. Areas covered included the frequency of the use of the hall by members as well as other clubs; major projects planned for the next five years as well as the overall structure and management of the club. Helene James to report back to the Townsville City Council and outlined the procedures that she had to follow. - Some small changes to Show schedule suggested for the Novice Section.
- Meeting with Townsville City Council previously discussed.
- Discussion was held about the exorbitant increase in the power bill. Checks to be made that the reading of the meter was actually correct. Noted the previous bill was an estimate. It was noted that the solar return was down. Is the unit functioning correctly and reduction due to rain periods? The committee will again look at this at the next meeting.
- From Townsville City Council they have assigned clubhouse address of 382B Charles Street, Kirwan and requested club that the property be appropriately signed. Troy to attend to this.
- A new Orchid Market for back yard sellers Orchidmart from New South Wales.
- Request for financial donations from Latin America to establish a library in Lankester Botanical Gardens in Costa Rica. Discussion held and resolved not to donate in this instance.

- Jeff Knowles suggested we buy a copy of a book '2021 Virtual World Orchid Conference'. Noel Grant advised that he has looked into this. The book is very large and suggested that it would be sold as CD. He had requested a price but had not received a reply.
- Invitation to Easter Bunny Hop at Bunnings on 30<sup>th</sup> March. 2023. Declined.
- It was noted that Charters Towers Orchids and Allied Plants Society Inc had closed their club due to the lack of members and interest. It is sad to see the club cease operating.

#### **Vice President Reports:**

#### Show Jan Allen

- Vice President Jan indicated the box day will be held on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March at 9am. Jan will remind members at the meeting and also send an email to members regarding this.
- Ribbons for the three shows this year have been purchased and have arrived.
- Advertising with the Townsville Bulletin has been arranged and paid for.
- Leonie Johnson will do the advertising for the show on the clubs' Facebook page.
- Jan spoke of the issue of some members simply emailing requests for barcode labels and not on the form as required. It was resolved that only requests on the form would be addressed in the future. The reason behind this is that a copy of all barcodes is available to members working the sales cash register should there be a problem with a label. Also, some members are ordering large numbers of barcodes which have a limited life span.
- A motion from Jan that "The TOS approves a float for the Autumn Show in the sum of \$1400" Seconded T McGill Carried
- Jan indicated that the cost of the bus for Ingham is \$1430 and at this time we have twenty-six members indicating that they are going. #### **General Business:**

- Greg Kelly spoke about the vote for the amendment to the constitution and the reasons for same. President Robyn then put the amendment to a vote which was carried.
- President Robyn advised that the flasks for plants to be given members next year had arrived and she would de-flask them in the near future. She had some of the flasks with her if members want to have a look at the flasks.
- Robyn indicated that she and Greg Kelly had a meeting with a council representative in reference to the new lease on the TOS Hall which is due for renewal in June next year. The representative had indicated that she could see no reason why the council would not renew our lease. She further stated that she could help with advice regarding grants to assist with planned upgrades to the hall. **Lecture:** Member Reg Dix provided the lecture on the topic of pH as it relates to Orchids.

- Reg spoke of the practice of a number of the better growers ensuring that the pH of their liquid fertiliser was within a given range in order that orchids could take better advantage of the products provided. He indicated that orchids in general prefer an acid product rather than an alkaline one.
- Reg explained that there is a difference between rainwater, town water and bore water in terms of pH levels
- The composition of various products was broken down. Reg demonstrated the products that he uses. He also demonstrated a couple of different pH meters and using the meters demonstrated how the pH reading of different types of water and how some products will change the pH of your water.
- Reg recommends that members keep their liquid products at a pH of between 5.6 and 6.3 for best results.

# What does 'pH' mean?

In 1909, the Danish chemist Søren Peter Lauritz Sørensen introduced the concept of pH.

'H' stands for Hydrogen, but Sørensen did not explain why he used the letter p, and the exact meaning of the letter is still disputed. [6]

Sørensen described a way of measuring pH using **potential** differences, and it represents the negative **power** of 10 in the concentration of hydrogen ions.

The letter *p* could stand for the French *puissance*, German *Potenz*, or Danish *potens*, all meaning "power", or it could mean "potential".

So: Power of Hydrogen, or Potential of Hydrogen – choose one!

National eDeposit (NED) is an exciting collaboration between Australia's nine national, state and territory libraries, responding to the major challenge of capturing and preserving the digital documentary history of Australia for the future. The NED service provides for the deposit, management, storage, preservation, discovery and delivery of published electronic material across Australia.

Paper copies from about 1991-2023 are available for viewing at the Townville City Council Library in Flinders Street. The TOS webpage holds the 2009-2023 copies.


