Minutes from the Management Committee Meeting held Friday, 21st April, 2023

Meeting opened: at 7.30pm by President Robyn Dundas

Present: Robyn Dundas, Lisa McCulloch, Greg Kelly, Samantha McGill, Jan Allen, Noel Grant, June Cairns and Stacey Fidler.

Apologies: Troy McGill and Rob Rasmussen.

Minutes:

Motion: That the minutes of the previous meeting be accepted as a true and correct record.

Business arising:

- Vice President Samantha advised that she had made some inquiries into the seemingly excessive power bill recently received. Samantha advised that she had compared the quarter with previous quarters and historically this quarter always was the dearest for electricity. With increased use of the hall, there was more energy consumed and that meant that there was less power to be sold to the grid.
- Bills of over \$1200 had been received previously in this time frame.
- Issues, including the failure of the air conditioner units to cut off when the time on the meter expired as well as the need for maintenance of the solar system, were discussed.
- President Robyn indicated that a deal of money was spent on the air-conditioning of the hall last year and the problems were still not corrected.
- Resolved that the issue should be continually monitored. The solar system should be cleaned and the system checked. Priority should be given to have the air-conditioning issues resolved.
- President Robyn advised that she had received a phone called from Helene James regarding the extension of the lease of the hall. James advised that she was recommending an extension and indicated that the club proceed to source quotes for the floor coverings and the painting of the hall.
- The extension of the lease would be finalised at the June meeting of the Townsville City Council.
- Robyn further advised that she had spoken to Councillor Russel Cook about a ten-year lease not five. Robyn forwarded her request by email to Councillor Cook to state her reasons for this.

Vice President Reports:

Show Jan Allen

- Jan reported that the Autumn Show went off fairly smoothly.
- Jan indicated that the number of plants in the show were down. Public attendance was down.
- Rosters for show were full with a couple of late withdrawals that were easily managed.
- Jan indicated that she had taken on faith that the vendors would enter the five required plants in the display and she should not have to check that each individual had done so. It was reported that one vendor had not complied with this requirement.
- Lisa commented that by reading the other clubs bulletins most of those clubs had fewer plants on display and less attendance. The weather did not help. She also commented that other clubs had a three-month period before a plant can be entered in competition and this club has six months wait. She indicated that this would inconvenience novice growers more.
- For the Ingham Field Day (30 April 2023) there were 24 confirmed attending with some more that had not decided if they were going or not. Jan to try and get a quote for a small bus if possible.
- For the Bowen Field Day, (21 May 2023) ten members had indicated an interest in attending.
- Both Field Days would be mentioned at the General Meeting.

Hospitality Samantha McGill

- Sam indicated that the format of the kitchen had been changed to see if room could be found for the display refrigerator. Sam indicated that the new format worked well and the only issue was members going to the back of the kitchen to help themselves to coffee/tea. Some were not mindful of others in the kitchen when handling the hot beverages.
- Further conversation was had re the purchase of a display refrigerator. Cost was prohibitive considering the limited use that would be made of it. Storage at other times would also be an issue.
- It was resolved not to take this matter any further at this time.

Building Report Troy McGill (Samantha provided report for Troy)

- Troy advised that Lyndell had inspected the hall and was compiling a quote for regular cleaning of the hall.
- Troy was obtaining quotes to fumigate the hall.
- Troy was organising the cleaning of all air conditioning units.
- Troy would also organise the cleaning and checking of the solar system of the hall.

General Business:

- President Robyn advised that she had contacted the floor covering man to reassess the costing to include the kitchen. The man needs to inspect the kitchen prior to making recommendations as to the floor covering in the kitchen. (Waterproof and anti-slip).
- Robyn indicated that Noelene Parker had advised she would assist in the Biggest Morning Tea.
 Organiser Janelle Stevens had been away but should be at the meeting on Sunday. Date set aside for event was 17 June, 2023.

Around the table

- Secretary Greg indicated that he had an issue with the fans in the hall being up as fast as possible during show set up and on meeting days. No need for fans at that speed and the wind blows the flowers and dries them out. To be raised in General Business at next General Meeting.
- Greg needs to order yellow ink for the printer. Need stock on hand to ensure that the printer is in working order.

- Greg advised the committee that he had forwarded a number of documents to the committee but many had not been delivered. Advised what he had forwarded and if any committee wanted these but had not received them to let him know and he would send them once again.
- June advised that she had a complaint about her asking a woman not to take sales plants into the display. Signs everywhere to support her action. No further action required.
- Noel advised that he had made some inquiries about the suggested purchase of a copy of the
 Proceedings of the Virtual World Orchid Conference 2021. Cost is A\$185. Book is over 450 pages
 in length. Discussion had over the cost and the numbers of members that would actually use the
 book. Resolved not to purchase the book.

Technical Advisor Charlie Truscott.

- Charlie continued on the points made by Reg Dix indicated that a couple of plants at the show also had Thrip and had to be removed from the show.
- Charlie spoke about the effect of Thai Rust and how contagious it can be. Severe infestations may lead to the death of plants.
- Charles spoke about the need for all members to ensure that their plants are clean prior to presentation as it will affect other growers. This disease produces spores that can germinate on other leaves. Moves in the air and also moves during watering of plants.

Lecture

Today's lecture was presented by Jeff Knowles who spoke on the topic of Bulbophyllums. An excellent presentation. Jeff with the help of Allison also showed us how he manufactures hanging baskets and how he secures plants to the basket.
