- Vice President Jan indicated that the rosters for the Winter Show and the kitchen for the show were being circulated at this meeting. Winter Show is from July7 to July 9.
- Jan spoke of wishing to implement an 'expert day' where newer members were able to bring plants and receive advice re pests and diseases. Newer members would also be shown how to correctly present their flowers for the show. Discussion took place and 24 June was decided as the day for this to occur. Jan to organise.
- Jan advised that 18 members travelled to Bowen for their Field Day and a good time was had by all.

• From Jan. Kitchen rosters being circulated as well as list of what members can provide for morning teas at the show.

Building Report Troy McGill Nil this month.

General Business:

- Jan provided an update on the state of health of the Triebels who were recently in a serious traffic accident. Help is needed. Especially for transport of Malcolm to see his wife Mary in hospital. Malcolm to have surgery in near future for an unrelated matter. Anyone that can help to speak to Jan.
- Jeff Knowles advised that Bruce Gray from Atherton and Ashley Field from Cairns were hopeful of obtaining an Australian Orchid Foundation (AOF) research grant to DNA survey Australian native antelope orchids in Northern Queensland. On another front, the AOF is propagating *Phal. amabilis* var. *rosenstromii*, (our club emblem) and they will sell them to help reduce plants being taken from the wild. (Members can purchase true *Phal. amabilis* var. *rosenstromii* plants from Bill Miles at Orchid Species Plus.)
- Jan Stevens spoke concerning the Biggest Morning Tea. A decision had been made to revert to June General Meeting as a donation day for the Cancer Council. There would be a better prize and the opportunity to donate on that day.

Judges Choice:

Open Section: Rlc Hsinying Dream 'Velvet Queen' 74 Points W&C Sewell

Novice Section: C Rosella's Double Flare 75 Points J Horn

Species Section: Paph spicerianum 70 points L&G Johnson

Judge Reg Dix spoke about a number of plants exhibiting signs of disease, mainly Thai rust. Some other plants were isolated and these along with some Vandas were not included in the judging.

Reg showed one of his Vandas that was clean as an example of how a plant should be.

Reg advised that any leaves of plants infected should be removed with sterile cutters. These cuts should be sealed with Steriprune (available from Bunnings) using a cotton bud. The cotton bud being replaced after being used on each individual plant.

If you cut the stem half way through this will induce the plant to throw kiekies which can be removed once the kiekie has established at least three roots. Note you will also need to continue treatment of this plant on an ongoing basis as the rot may be transferred to the new growth.

He also advised that when the temperature goes down under 15 degrees, he sprays his vandas and other orchids with a mix of Mancozeb and Spreadmax (both available from Bunnings) as a protection against fungal spores. Spray on both sides of the leaves avoiding runoff from the leaves. Top of pot should also be sprayed. You will also need to spray your plants with a systemic fungicide with treatment being ongoing until such time as the plant does not show symptoms of the Thai rust.

Technical Advisor

Charlie Truscott indicated that it was his role to improve the standard of plants within the club. Charlie spoke of the effects of black spot and other fungus on orchid plants.

- He indicated that he used Banrot 400WP (Thiophanate-methyl) as it kills 100% of the Disease and fungal spores, as well as preventing new infections. This product is expensive but worth the outlay. Should be used in conjunction with Mancozeb. Spray Mancozeb more regularly to kill the spores.
- Richgro Bug Killa is a Granular Garden Insecticide. This is used on the top of potting media. It is stocked by the club.
- Charlie also spoke of the use of Envy as a preventative spray. Envy is normally used when deflasking occurs as it reduces the dehydration of small plants. It can be sprayed on all plants and leaves a film on the plants which inhibits the spores.

Secretary's Note

Charlie Truscott provided the Society with a copy of his presentation on Phalaenopsis. Contained in that presentation are points relating to the maintenance of clean plants. I believe that this would be applicable to all genera of orchids and running through the presentation would be helpful to most. The presentation is on our website http://townsvilleorchidsociety.org.au/ on the "Orchid Growing" page.

Lecture

The lecture for today was provided by Charlie Truscott on the topic of growing phalaenopsis orchids in Townsville. This presentation covered all areas relating to the topic and was very warmly received. Meeting Closed at 2.45pm
