- Charlie Truscott spoke on the need to ensure the PH balance, when using any chemical, is in the optimal range for the product. Most products provide advice at what PH level provides the best use of the product.
- Charlie also identified a number of ways members could test the PH levels of their water and mixes.

Member Bruno Fighera showed members the steps necessary to pollinate an orchid flower which will eventually result in a seed pod that in time will result in orchid plants.

Minutes from the General Meeting held Sunday 27 August, 2023

Meeting opened at 1pm by President Robyn who welcomed all attendees.

Present: As per registration book.

Visitors: There were no visitors at this meeting.

New Members: There were no new members at this meeting

Minutes:

- Due to an oversight the minutes of the previous meeting were not published in the monthly Bulletin and due to this the Secretary was unable move a motion that the minutes of the previous meeting were true and correct.
- The Secretary had a paper copy of the minutes if any member wished to view them.

Business out of Minutes:

- The roof of the hall has been re-screwed and the invoice paid.
- The solar panels have been replaced but unfortunately, we have a problem with the second system on the roof. We do have two separate systems, one being 2.5kw and the second being 1.7 kw. With the new technology of the panels, they were unable to operate the two inverters. It appears that the second system has not been registered with Ergon when installed years ago. We will be contacting Ergon in the next week to ask what can be done to rectify the problem without losing the 44 cent rebate.

Correspondence: Nil new correspondence relevant to this meeting. During the period the club received a power point presentation which relates to the winners of the Australian Hybrid Orchids. There are 55 slides in the power point. If anyone is interested in seeing this, please advise the secretary and he will forward the power point to them.

Business from Committee Meeting:

• The committee decided at their meeting that the cost for the Christmas Party is \$25 per member and \$40 for guests. Committee also resolved that the club would purchase \$500 of orchid plants for the party. These plants would be purchased from Alice's Orchids and Sunnyview Orchids equally. He will assist any one at the expert day and show them how to stake effectively.


Today's lecture was provided by Bruno Fighera who spoke on how he goes about the propagation and flasking of orchids. This was very interesting.

This showed how the need for sterilisation process had been simplified using everyday products in order that children could be taught the process in schools. This was to assist the with proliferation of endangered species. The plants are to be propagated and dispersed from schools and similar facilities.
