- The Ribbons for the show have been ordered.

Ingham Field Day.

• Jan advised that she had not obtained a quote for this year's trip but working on last year's cost recommended that the club hire a bus and charge \$40 per member and \$50 per non-member for the day. Jan also advised the additional cost of the meal, had been increased to \$15. (Meal actually increased to \$12.) Starter list to be handed around at General Meeting.

General Business:

• Troy advised that he had removed the incorrect address on the building. Carolyn advised the address she had used on the flyers came from Google. She had since changed the address. Greg indicated that it would be preferable to use the actual address of the clubhouse as provided by the Townsville City Council,

- There was prolonged discussion about the trophies and Bunnings vouchers given at the Christmas Party for the winners of various competitions. One primary issue was the value of winning the Points Section against winning the Judges choice for the section.

- Whilst discussing the above, it was stated that members do not know how those competitions work.
 Greg advised that for the past five years members had a document forwarded to them explaining this but most do not read the document. Noel will speak on the competitions at the General Meeting on Sunday.

Autumn Show

Cultural Notes April 2024

General observations

The sun has crossed the equator and is now in the northern hemisphere. Night is longer than day. The European 'Autumn' is here.

From the Kakadu Mob perspective, Kudjewk – the monsoon season is over, Bangkerreng – the 'Knock 'em down' storm season is with us. Temperatures for April. $23^{\circ}C$ – $34^{\circ}C$

Clear skies prevail. Floodwater is receding and streams start to run clear again. Most of Kakadu's plants are fruiting and its animals are caring for their young.

The early days of *bangkerreng* are marked by violent, windy storms that flatten the speargrass – these are called 'knock 'em down' storms. https://parksaustralia.gov.au/kakadu/discover/nature/seasons/

The days are getting cooler, therefore less evaporation, less growth, less transpiration. Reduce watering.

Pests and Diseases

Look for chewing insects. Spray if found – pyrethrum, 'Success', 'Mavrik', 'Diazamin 200', 'Ficam W' Look for spider mites. They should not be a problem until the humidity drops. Rotate mitacides on a 7 day interval at least 3 treatments. 'Supracide' is a good miticide.

Spray preventative fungicide. Triforine, Alginox are systemic fungicides, Mancozeb is a surface fungicide. Good air circulation is a good fungicide

Safety First!! Remember that all horticultural poisons are poisonous to humans if mistreated.

The Cattleya Alliance

Reduce watering. Water only once or twice a week depending on the weather and your potting mix. Fertilise weakly, weekly. Alternate between Hi N and Lo N fertilisers (High Nitrogen, Low Nitrogen). Check new leads for damp off. Treat with a systemic fungicide and increase air flow in your orchid house. Check for Dendrobium beetle and spider mites. Refer to notes in 'Pests and Diseases' above.

Oncidium Alliance

Our "Wet" Season is over – Reduce water but do not allow to dry out. Keep moist. Water early mornings Alternate fertiliser. Weakly, weekly. Hi N / Lo N. Spray Mancozeb to shield against fungus.

Paphiopedilum

Our 'Wet' Season is over– Keep moist but not wet. Water / mist daily. Avoid wetting flowers & buds Weak Campbells Yellow (flowering) every 2nd water. Lo N, Hi PK. Check for mealy bug & anthracnose. Heat stress should be less of a problem. Increase shade if plants show stress

Phalaenopsis

Our "Wet' Season is over. Water / mist daily. Mornings best time

Early flower spikes might appear. Stake early. Use bloom booster fertiliser. Weakly, weekly. (Lo N, Hi PK fertiliser)

Check for cockroaches, mealy bug, spider mites & anthracnose. Beware of crown rot.

Vandaceous

Our "Wet" Season may be over but many Vandas originate from areas with regular rain, so water daily. Hi N / Balanced fertiliser. Weakly, weekly.

Be aware of crown rot & Thai disease. Watch for grasshoppers.

Phalaenanthe Dendrobium

Cease watering if flowering finished. Morning misting to maintain canes. Cold will cause leaf drop. Do not water if cool. Fertilise weakly, weekly. Lo N, Higher PK

Stake new flower spikes, if they appear. Check for Dendrobium beetle, Spider mites.

Intermediate Dendrobium

Decrease water as weather cools. Seedlings should be kept damp. Fertiliser. Weakly, weekly. Lo N

Stake new flower spikes, if they appear.

Check new leads for damp off. Check for Dendrobium beetle, red spider

Repot before cold weather.

Canaliculatum Dendrobium (Our local orchid)

Our 'Wet' Season is over. Reduce water. Just enough to maintain canes. Mist whenever you have a heavy dew.

Minimum fertiliser. Weak, Lo N

Check new leads for damp off. Fungicide when misting

Check for Dendrobium beetle, red spider.

PS. The European 4 seasons do not adequately define our climate in North Queensland. I feel the first nations' understanding is more appropriate. However, I am unable to find anything pertinent to the Townsville area. I have used the seasons of the Kakadu area as it is on the east coast of the Northern Territory. If anyone has some info on the first nations' seasons for the Townsville area, please let me know.

SHOW VICE PRESIDENT - REPORT

Well, a new year brings new ventures. After a long break (Townsville Field Day in October was the last event I needed to organise) preparation for the Autumn Show and Ingham Field Day is well and truly in progress.

Advertising is organised (thanks Carolyn Gibson), Show ribbons are ordered and rosters were passed around at the last meeting. As we only have two weeks between the March meeting and the **2024 Autumn Show**, I have sent out the rosters via email to members, just in case you missed the last meeting and would like to contribute to helping at the Show. If you sold plants last year, you will probably also receive an email from me, confirming if you still require a table. By the time this Bulletin is published, our 'Ask the Expert' Day will have come and gone. We started this last year as it was felt that there was not enough time at our monthly Sunday meetings for members to make enquiries about their own plants. Advice on how to present your plant, stake your flowers and whether a plant has a fungal disease or pest is what we aim to provide. Last year, as I remember, there was also a repotting demonstration. We plan to run this three times a year – one to two weeks prior to our Shows.

The Herbert River Orchid & Allied Plants Society Inc. Field Day is an event that the TOS has supported for many years. It is very well organised and great fun. We are providing a bus. It was agreed at the last Management meeting that supporting other Orchid Societies and the advantages of providing a way members could attend these events, outweighed a small financial loss. To minimise the loss, we will be organising a smaller bus (24 seater) with a trailer, should we have 22 or fewer people using the service. I will need to know by the March meeting, and payment will need to be made by 31st March. Bus - \$40pp (member), \$50pp (non-member) and lunch - \$12pp.

Unfortunately, the **Bowen Orchid and Foliage Society** has advised us that they will not have a Field Day this year.

Banrot systemic fungicide

There has recently been some discussion about an effective systemic fungicide called Banrot, which is a wettable powder used in a spray.

Most members have been discouraged because it is usually available in a 1kg pack, which sells for about \$1,000. While it is possible to break this pack into smaller (more affordable) parcels among several members, most people have not proceeded with the purchase.

Good news! I have done a bit of detective work and I have found Banrot is for sale in 20-gram plastic bottles for \$20 each (plus a small postage amount), from

https://www.nutriflo.com.au/product/banrot-20gms-additive/

Nutriflo is a supplier for hydroponic systems.

Caution: This product has been classified as a **Schedule 5 Poison**, so proper personal protection precautions must be taken when using it. Therefore, it is **essential** that users wear full covering – hat, mask, gloves, long pants, long-sleeved shirt – including, and especially, when preparing the spray. Launder all the clothes after using the spray, and take a full shower.
