Autumn Show

- Ribbons have been ordered and have been despatched.
- The rosters have been circulated by email. In particular help is required for the Kitchen Roster.
- Flyers will be made available for members who wish to distribute or display them for the show.
- Set up for the show will be on Thursday 4th April at 10am. Assistance will be required for that and also the pencilling at the judging of the show that evening.
- Jan indicated that she was happy with the outcome of the "Ask the Expert Day". Most who attended learnt something.
- The box day had gone well, finishing at about 11am.

Herbert River Field Day

- Jan advised that she had a number of quotes for the bus hire for the day. Same bus as last year (57-seater) would cost an additional \$500. Jan has arranged for the tentative hire of a 24-seat bus and trailer at a similar price to the full-sized bus of last year.
- Numbers of members who have indicated that they wish to go is very low and would not support the hire of any bus. This will be raised at the General Meeting and a decision will be made after numbers are obtained at that meeting.

• It was resolved that Samantha would take over the duties of stocking the club's refrigerator.

Building Report Wally Brooker

- Wally advised that the repairs to the air conditioners had been completed and all units were now working satisfactorily.
- DMC had been asked to provide advice on what is required to ensure that the system is maintained and functional.
- The air conditioning units need to receive regular cleaning which surpasses what members can provide.
- Discussion was had over the cost of the work completed.
- Wally advised that Plumber to your Door should complete the repairs of cyclone damage in the next week. It takes time to have the parts made as required.

General Business:

- President Troy advised that the Eco Event will be hell in Anderson Park on 2nd June. He would like the club to obtain a table, show some plants and perhaps obtain new members.

- Troy advised that he had attended the Mackay Orchid Show and that the club struggled for flowers. This may be an issue at our Autumn Show.
- Troy spoke of the Eftpos training earlier that day and the limited number who attended. Further discussion was held concerning when the surcharges would be applied to the Eftpos machine. As well as the Eftpos being available at meetings, members still had the option of either paying cash or electronic deposits into the club's account.
