**Council** – some members have indicated their support for collaborating with the Council on adding appropriate orchids to trees in front of the Council chambers and in the Anderson Park bushhouse. **Technical Report** – Jeff Knowles

- Gave a handout to members.
  - Safety. MSDS materials safety data sheets contain information about those chemicals through an MSDS or SDS. Some information on sheet might be completely irrelevant to us eg shipping
- Make sure the chemicals are safe to use. Synthetic pyrethrum is still available.
- Causes cancer? Warnings should be on there.

Spring has sprung. Not too hot and not too cold.

- **Catts** new roots are starting to be thrown out. Time to repot. Try not to break off those root once you repot then they will take off. If the roots are near the edge of the pot time to repot.
- **Dendrobium** throwing roots, start to water more and up the fertiliser. Phalaenanthe dendrobium are ready to grow at this stage once they start to grow give lots of water and food to help them grow. If they are dry and hot, you might end up with mites.
- Time to spray for mites drench them so that the mites are not in the medium. Need a miticide not an insecticide.
- Wettable sulphur safe. Mangazeb Plus has fungicide and miticide. Not systemic. Small collection would be ok for small nurseries.

### There are some very high powered miticides that we don't usually use.

- Good to alternate miticides because they could build up resistance.
- Neem oil is it a miticide? Good to rotate with other things.
- Mix fertilisers and insecticides together but know what you are using.
- Identify the problem then spray for the problem.

**Early sign that you have mites.** Will get a number of shoots instead of a strong stem. Once they are on the leaves you have a very large infestation – silver leaf underneath. If you rub your finger over the leaf you will end up with red stripes on it.

### Judges Choice - Peter Lucke

**Open Section:** Paph (St Swithins x rothschildiana) x Pinocchio, L. Johnson73 pointsSlipper orchid – they reflex back a bit and can lose points for that. Will be good in time for show.**Species:** Den macrophyllumF. Davison74 pointsNew guinea species. Used a lot in breeding. Grow well in Townsville. Don't like repotting so try not to disturb it.Novice: Den Spring Dream 'Apolion'L,B&M O'Neil 74 points

Crisp, clean flower.

Novices who put plants on the table were congratulated for their healthy, clean, crisp plants. Some senior growers talked about various genera.

### John Nuss - looked at some of the Dendrobium species on display, one being -

**Dendrobium speciosum –** wowed the first Europeans who saw them in Sydney. Has a strong but very pleasant perfume. Grows almost from the Victorian border through New South Wales and up to and just beyond the Atherton Tablelands. Comes in about 10 different varieties these days. The variety on the table is possibly *Den speciosum var. hillii.* 

### Bruno Fighera - commented on some of the Cattleya.

Mini Catts – both first and second place in very good shape.

Spotted ones in pretty good shape – partial to them. Might not be award winning but very pretty. Common one 'Karen Sunrise'

Multiflora plants. Looked at one with lots of flowers - *Cattleya skinneri* (a species).

Bruno grows his Catts in perlite with stones on top. Because of his water, Bruno does not use Quincan as the Quincan collects salts and sediments and after 8 months the roots are damaged. Drainage rock doesn't hold water but creates a type of mulch on top. Stops the perlite drying out so quickly.

### **Presentation – Ray Layton**

Ray explained that he was going to depart from the usual presentation that we are used to.

He would be using and explaining more scientific terms such as Electrons, Proton

Electromagnetic radiation, Energy, and Thermodynamics.

His lecture explained how and where Photosynthesis takes place in plants and showed diagrams about the Photosynthetic pathway.

Magnesium is important as it is part of the Chlorophyll action. Ray concluded that feeding orchids is the job of the sun.

### Cultural Notes for next month - October

### General observations

For the Kakadu mob: The season of Kurrung (hot and dry) will remain until mid-October. Then the pre-monsoon season of Kunumeleng starts. This is the start of hot and humid weather.

Thunderstorms build in the afternoons and the dry land greens up. The streams begin to run. Barramundi move from the waterholes to the estuaries to breed, and waterbirds spread out with the increased surface water and plant growth. https://parksaustralia.gov.au/kakadu/discover/culture/country/

Townsville averages - humidity low but building, daytime temperatures highs around 28°C and about 21°C at night. Only expect one day of rain during the month. The tropical 'Dry' season is still with us.

### Pests and Diseases

Look for attack from chewing insects, mealy bugs. Ants become a problem. Spray if found – pyrethrum, 'Success', 'Mavrik', 'Diazamin 200', 'Ficam W'

Spider mites become active. Rotate mitacides - 7 day interval At least 3 treatments. 'Torque'

Preventative fungicide spray - Mancozeb, Alginox, Triforine, Bravo. Good air circulation is a good fungicide.

Safety First!! Remember that all horticultural poisons are poisonous to humans if mistreated.

### The Cattleya Alliance

Water once a week, depending on weather and mix. Mist to keep humidity up. Increase watering as temperature rises. Fertilise weakly, weekly. Alternate Hi N, Lo N

Check new leads for damp off. Check for Dendrobium beetle, Spider mites.

Storms can trigger fungal attack. Spray as required.

### **Catasetum Alliance**

The monsoonal 'Dry is here. The plants will drop their leaves and start their hibernation period. When that happens, cease watering. Move the plants to a section of the orchid house that does not get wet.

### **Oncidium Alliance**

Keep moist. Water early mornings. As the weather warms up, water more often. Alternate fertiliser. Weakly, twice weekly. Hi N / Lo N. High light levels for flowering. Good air movement. Look for insect damage - thrips, ants, mealy bugs, spider mites.Spray if found.

### **Phaphiopedilum**

Keep moist but not wet. Water / mist daily. Avoid wetting flowers & buds. Stake flower spikes.

Weak Campbells Yellow every 2<sup>nd</sup> water. Lo N, Hi PK. Check for mealy bug & anthracnose.

### **Phalaenopsis**

Water twice a week. As the weather warms up, water more often. Keep moist but not wet - mornings best time. Weakly, weekly. with Lo N Hi PK fertiliser

Check for mealy bug, spider mites & anthracnose. Good air movement & humidity.

Beware of crown rot. Stake flower spikes.

### **Vandaceous**

Water daily in morning. As the weather warms up, water more often (twice a day). Weakly, weekly. Lo N fertiliser. Be aware of crown rot & Thai disease. Watch for grasshoppers- Carbaryl spray. Good air circulation

#### Phalaenanthe Dendrobium

As new growth appears, start watering. Fertilise weakly, weekly-Hi N fertiliser. Maintain watch on fungal attack. Check for Dendrobium beetle, Spider mites, ants. Start of growing season. Divide & Repot.

### **Canaliculatum and Antelope type Dendrobium**

Water once a week (or less).Keep damp but not wet. Be aware of the often-heavy morning dew. Wet plants in the same way. Weak fertiliser when watering - Lo N. Check new leads for damp off. Check for Dendrobium beetle, they should be less active. Red spider mites are more active. Good air movement. High light levels. (Some trees shed old leaves at this time).

#### Soft Cane Dendrobium

Should be in bud or flowering. Start to increase the shade. These plants seem to do better out of your orchid house.
