Minutes from the Annual General Meeting held Sunday 27th October 2024

Meeting opened at 1.10pm by President Troy McGill.

Minutes of Previous Annual General Meeting. These minutes were re-published in the October 2024 TOS Bulletin.

Treasurer's Report: Auditors report completed and was made available for members to view. Nothing untoward or out of the ordinary was noted by the auditor. M: Lisa McCulloch S: T McGill. Carried

Business arising: • J. Knowles noted that the rates were much higher than the last financial year and asked why? Treasurer McCulloch explained that three periods were paid this year whereas last year it was two.

• J. Knowles questioned why our electricity bill was much higher this financial year. Treasurer McCulloch explained that there had been trouble with the solar power inverters and periods where the coin box was not working properly, and air-conditioning had remained on. Troy explained that True Solar had been contracted to fix the solar problem and the air conditioners had been fixed. • R. Dix asked what we charge groups for electricity. President McGill explained that we charge the groups a set fee and they pay for the air-conditioning through the coin box. Reg suggested we should be looking a different system.

• J. Cairns enquired about whether there are groups who don't pay rent. J. Allen explained that there are two not-for-profit community groups that we allow to use the Hall (U3A French class) and Australasian Native Orchid Society Inc fee free. The thinking behind this is that it was suggested in a meeting with a Council representative that it would be beneficial when applying for grants if we were seen to be assisting some community groups.

President's Address (Troy McGill) The President provided his report. He mentioned the Committee's commitment to making the Orchid Society more visible in the community with members attending Community events such as the Eco-Fiesta and the Bluewater Gardening Fair. We are also planning to collaborate with the local Council on small projects. He thanked everyone for the work they have done this year. He spoke further about the success of the three Orchid Shows and our new initiative this year to have a Plant Sale in December. The president declared all club positions vacant. Returning Officer John Nuss took control of the meeting. He thanked all officers of the Management Committee and all those who have worked successfully for the Society this year.

- Sheet has been prepared to collect number of participants.

General Business –

- **Green Space Day** – the club's participation in the Green Space Open Day was successful and resulted in the donation of an irrigation system by Holman. This will be used as a prize at the Christmas Luncheon.
- **New Membership Cards** – these have been printed and will be available for collection at the General meeting for current financial members. So far, they offer discounts at North Queensland Hydroponics and Project Plants. A member will follow up with Lamberts regarding the request for a club membership.
- **Orchid Tour** – received information about a 24-day orchid tour to Thailand. Costing - \$7,500 per person plus airfares.

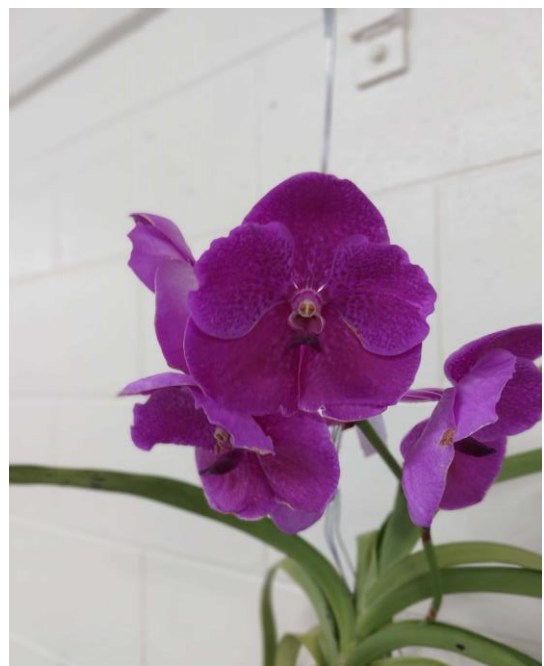
